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

You can imagine how challenged we were to meet this dear brother and hear him preach boldly the word of God. The last night he spoke we saw half an hour of photos from Australia depicting the places and people where he would shortly return to minister. The last photo was of an old broken down aboriginal drunkard pointing his finger at the camera when Bro. Pike took his photo. Bro. Randy used that pointed finger to challenge us that night to ask God if he would have us, all of us, any of us to serve Him in Australia. The rest is history, 43 years of it this month. We receive Bro. and Mrs. Pike's prayer letters, so when the last one came, I decided to use it as the Feature Article in the March Heads Up, along with several other biographical excerpts from his letters. Dear helpers of our faith "IT TAKES A LICKING AND KEEPS ON TICKING!"

Years ago, the Timex Watch Company advertised their product under the above motto. Various ads showed their watches being submerged under water, ran over by a truck, dug out of the ruins of a collapsed building, buried in sand and soil - and it was still ticking! From his death cell in Rome, Paul wrote his dearest friend Timothy these words: "Thou therefore endure hardness, as a good soldier of Jesus Christ" (2 Tim. 2:3). He did not say, "Have prayer and your hardships will go away." The New Testament doctrine of "enduring" is greatly unknown among modern day Christians.

We have been taught that prayer will solve all problems: pray and your suffering vanishes; your bills ended; your children will behave, your boss will be nice; your paycheck increase, and so on. In other words, prayer is the cure all for all things unpleasant in our lives.

Only a fool would play down or diminish the power and Divine benefits of holy prayer. However, to make it an escape hatch from the sorrows and sufferings of human life is sheer tomfoolery.

Most physical hardships and sufferings have to be endured. God may choose to remove something here or there, but the rule is to "endure."

A pastor phoned me and said he was going to resign his church because of the trouble and problems caused by carnal, mean, (and possibly unsaved) members. I told him he was doing wrong and must learn to "endure" these awful things.

My wife and I have had to live much or our 60 years together like this; "take a licking and keep on ticking." The past six months dropped on us, a major heart attack (for my wife) and surgery following, an accident with me suffering both legs broken. All of this entailed weeks of hospitalization and loss of work, Prayer did not remove any of it, but gave grace and comfort to bear it !!!!!

Slowly, these calamities have turned into avenues for the gospel of Christ to run into the lives of many. And we had to "endure" it all.

In Galatians 6:2, Paul commanded, "Bear one another's burdens." In verse 5, he wrote, "every man shall bear his own burden." We ask, "Which is it, Paul?" Simply this: you have burdens that I can help you carry; but you also have sorrows and sufferings that I am unable to share. Thus, we help where we can and "endure" the rest. Readers, learn to "take a licking and keep on ticking" for Jesus.

In 2 Cor 11, Paul lists over 30 horrible experiences in his service as a missionary covering some 20 years. He could not pray his way out of any of them, they had to be endured while praying. In the next chapter 12, he gloried in it all for they gave him the power of Christ in Christian service (verses 8-10). He took the lickings and kept on ticking for Jesus!

God gives us grace to keep on ticking amid all the lickings we get. Don't fret, it will be alright in heaven and all of us will arrive their on time!

Here's a good life's motto: "When in a fix remember Phil 4:6." I got this over forty years ago from a dear Australian brother named Kevin Deuter.



It is untrue that God always gives what we ask. Verses in the Bible that seems to state this (for example Matt. 21:22) are under the Divine decision of 1 John 5:14; it reads, "... if we ask anything according to his will, he heareth us." That's how God answers. Paul's prayer to remove the thorn from his body was not God's will. It was through his suffering that the power of Christ was upon his life (verse 9).

This unanswered prayer was actually answered prayer! Could affliction, pain, and trouble be a blessing? My brother fell ill with brain cancer. Because of this, I won him to Christ before he died.

Some of you would be better off with pain, loss, and unmitigated sorrow tearing into your life, if it saved you from hell.

As an 18-year-old boy, I was knocked cold in a high school football game and paralyzed in both legs from the hips down. Thousands of prayers went up from family, churches, and friends asking God to restore my legs. I spent the next 60 years walking on braces and crutches. Now, nearly 82 years old, bent over in a wheel chair, and bed ridden, their prayers were never answered! Looking back, had God not taken away the function of my legs I would never have given my life as a missionary in His

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service. Psalm 119:67, "Before I was afflicted I went astray: but now have I kept thy word." Spiritually minded believers see through the big talk about jackpot prayers. This satanic lie has deceived millions. None of us knows what waits down the road. Some will face cancer, heart attack, Alzheimers, dementia, family separations, deadly car wrecks, and loss of job, financial ruin, stokes, or dissertation by a mate or child and so on.

The preaching that prayer will save us from the natural ills of this life is nonsense. Our Savior as a human struggled with the thought of His fellowship with the Father being broken while he became sin on the cross (2 Cor. 5:21). He prayed that it would not happen (Matt. 26:39) but it did.

If God never answers another prayer for me, when I look at the cross, and what Christ did there, I bow in thankful shame. Yes, unanswered prayer can sometimes be answered prayer after all. Got any in your life?

so I asked Ma to help me remember some of the churches we've seen up close and personal and what we used to call 'em.

The folks there got the idear there might be oil under the church property so they drilled and got a gusher, and then closed the membership so nobody else could join. We reckon they should changed the name after that to Royalties Baptist Church. And there was that one we dropped into on a trip back from Grandma's house, and they were so puffed up over their flash new church building that nobody spoke to us at all before, durin', or after. We reckon they oughta change the name to Toadfish Baptist. 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The chapters of 1 Chronicles 7 & 8 refer to soldiers in several verses. Note valiant men of might (7:2), bands of soldiers for war (7:4), valiant men of might (7:5), mighty men of valour (7:7,9,11; 8:40), fit to go out for war and battle (7:11), and choice and mighty men of valour...apt to the war and to battle (7:40) describe these warriors.

A soldier reminds us that there are enemies, battles, victories, and losses.

Several times the Apostle Paul reminded his readers that the Christian life, and especially that of a Christian leader, is filled with warfare and weapons.

- Let us put on the armour of light (Rom 13:12);
- Who goeth a warfare any time at his own charges (1Cor 9:7);
- For if the trumpet give an uncertain sound, who shall prepare himself to battle? (1Cor 14:8);
- By the armour of righteousness on the right hand and on the left (2Cor 6:7);
- For though we walk in the flesh, we do not war after the flesh: For the weapons of our warfare are not carnal, but mighty through God to the pulling down of strong holds (2Cor 10:3,4);
- But let us, who are of the day, be sober, putting on the breastplate of faith and love; and for an helmet, the hope of salvation (1Th 5:8);
- This charge I commit unto thee, son Timothy, according to the prophecies which went before on thee, that thou by them mightest war a good warfare (1Tim 1:18);
- Fight the good fight of faith (1Tim 6:12);
- Thou therefore endure hardness, as a good soldier of Jesus Christ. No man that warreth entangleth himself with the affairs of this life; that he may please him who hath chosen him to be a soldier (2Tim 2:3,4);
- I have fought a good fight (2Tim 2:3,4).

Even the classic passage in Ephesians 6 listing the spiritual armour is memorized by many, known by more, and needed for all believers.

The writer of Hebrews sounds the same note. Consider Hebrews 4:12 where God's Word is likened to a soldier's sword, For the word of God is quick, and powerful, and sharper than any twoedged sword. How about 10:32 which clearly notes the recipients' early Christian life of persecution, But call to remembrance the former days, in which, after ye were illuminated, ye endured a great fight of afflictions. Hebrews 11:34 reiterates this truth with the words, Quenched the violence of fire, escaped the edge of the sword, out of weakness were made strong, waxed valiant in fight, turned to flight the armies of the aliens.

Obviously the writers of the Epistles echo the instruction of our Lord when He said, *I send you forth as sheep in the midst of wolves* (Mt 10:16; Lu 10:3). In other words, his sheep were going out into the midst of a hostile environment.

Be it Jesus' day, Paul's day, or our day there is a battle to face and fight.

It is no different for a foreign missionary. If a man thinks he will avoid a battle by moving to a foreign field, he has another "think" coming. Missionaries are often, it seems, soldiers on the front lines of battle. Continually they will face the enemies of the gospel head on, become weary in the battle, and experience both victories and defeats. They must know their weapons (Word of God and prayer) and be equipped with God-given armor. The mission field battle field is not a place for ill-equipped or ill-trained soldiers.

Sending missionaries out to fight the good fight of faith who have not been to "boot camp" is an unwise investment with time and treasure. Long days, unusual terrain, devilish strongholds and constant battles can weary any combatant.

Brethren, pray for your missionaries fervently and frequently!

Jihad, the New Kind of Warfare

Before he moved to Medina, Mohammed had never used violence. Now that he had the means, he began to attack the Meccans, who had spurned his calls to Islam. On the face of it, this was just an attack by a tribal leader; (Mohammed) designed to steal goods from a group of his rivals. In fact this was the start of a war which Mohammed and his followers would wage against all of his enemies (the Kaffirs) forever.

As this war progressed, Mohammed would develop a strategy for an entirely new system of warfare, which Mohammed called Jihad. Westerners translate Jihad as "holy war" but it is in fact far more than this. Whilst Mohammed was a very capable Military tactician, Jihad barely concerns itself with military tactics. If it had done so, Jihad would have been rendered obsolete as soon as it encountered newer and more effective military technologies, such as crossbows or guns.

Warfare, like all types of violent coercion, has a psychological aspect to it, which is in many ways more important than the actual violence itself. Mohammed's genius was his understanding of this psychology, and in the way he incorporated it into the tactics of Jihad.

Because of this, Jihad is effective whether you are fighting with bows and arrows, or laser guided rockets. As the story unfolds, we will see how the strategy of Jihad was developed and applied. I will begin to list these as they appear:

Rules of Jihad:

- 1. Jihad is sanctioned by Allah. There is no higher authority; therefore it is always justified.
- 2. Never abide by any rules or limitations, the ends justify ANY means no matter how shocking. Jihad can be any action which advances Islam or weakens the Kaffirs, whether by a group or an individual. Even donating money to pay for someone else's Jihad is a type of Jihad itself.

- 3. ALWAYS play the victim. Mohammed twisted his situation around. Although he had attacked innocent people without provocation he blamed them because they had "stopped others from becoming Muslims" and had worshiped idols. The attack was their fault, and the Muslims were the victims, not the Kaffirs.
- 4. Keep repeating this over and over and people will eventually begin to believe it. If you can persuade the victim to accept the blame you have won, because retaliation requires a sense of injustice. If the victim accepts the blame they will turn their hatred towards themselves.

FULL-BRED AUSSIE WITH A LONGING FOR SHARIA LAW

IBRAHIM Siddiq-Conlon has a message for Australians, whether they want to hear it or not.

"One day Australia will be ruled by sharia, no doubt," he declares. "That is why non-Muslims are worried, because they know one day they won't be able to drink their beer, they won't be able to eat their pork and they won't be able to do their homosexual acts, because one day they know they will be controlled."

Siddiq-Conlon sits on the steps of the NSW Parliament House, the location he has chosen to launch his rhetorical attack on democracy, which he describes as "an evil system of life".

"Right now in the Western world we're on the edge of a crisis, of extinction, because of democracy. OK, so don't

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tell me democracy has the answers and is peaceful. Democracy is the reason for the world's problems."

Siddiq-Conlon is the face and voice of Sharia4Australia, a group formed in Sydney's southwest to agitate for Islamic law, starting with the introduction of sharia courts and ending, in his ideal world, with Islamic rule. While he claims to eschew violence, he unapologetically preaches hate. An online video posted by his group describes its members as "uncompromising [in] their disallegiance, disloyalty and hate for the disbelievers".

"I hate the parliament. I hate [democracy] with a pure hate," he says. Moreover, it is obligatory for all Muslims to reject democracy, because it is a challenge to God's law: "They must hate it, speak out against it, and if that doesn't work, take action against it."

Siddiq-Conlon formed Sharia4Australia last year, styling himself as the new champion for Islamic law in Australia.

An online video announcing its emergence stated: "For far too long now Aust has been ruled by a corrupt evil infedile [sic] group of people who are clear disbelievers in the sight of Allah. It is time for change. Time at least for the truth.

"Today Muslim youth and the oppressed and weak Muslims march forward with their flags behind brother Ibrahim Siddiq-Conlon. O Muslims stand tall, take the vow and pledge allegiance to none other than Allah and his Messengerorting and vowing allegiance w the Muslims while disloyalty to the disbelievers and their kufr [infidel] ways."

In person, Siddiq-Conlon initially seems harmless enough. He dresses in a white cotton tunic, trousers and sandals, with a neatly trimmed beard and a touch of black kohl eyeliner, in the style said to have been favored by the original companions of the Prophet Mohammed.

He is quietly spoken, polite and articulate; a master's graduate in architecture from the University of Technology, Sydney; Adelaide-born, and raised in a Godfearing "fundamentalist", he says, Christian family in rural NSW. He converted to Islam while a student, travelled to Indonesia, found a wife there, and returned to Australia with the full-blown zeal of so many converts. He formerly studied under the Ahlus Sunnah Wal Jama'ah Association, headed by Melbourne cleric Sheikh Mohammed Omran, but the association has recently moved to distance itself from his strident inflammatory message.

"I'm an Aussie, I'm a full-bred Aussie, you can't get more Aussie than me," he insists.



THE ISLAMIC STATE IS INDEED ISLAMIC

We are misled ... by a well-intentioned but dishonest campaign to deny the Islamic State's medieval religious nature... The reality is that the Islamic State is Islamic.

Very Islamic....



Virtually every major decision and law promulgated by the Islamic State adheres to what it calls, in its press and pronouncements, and on its billboards, license plates, stationery, and coins, "the Prophetic methodology," which means following the prophecy and example of Muhammad, in punctilious detail. Muslims can reject the Islamic State; nearly all do.... But Muslims who call the Islamic State un-Islamic are typically, as the Princeton scholar Bernard Haykel, the leading expert on the group's theology, told me, "embarrassed and politically correct, with a cottoncandy view of their own religion" that neglects "what their religion has historically and legally required." Many denials of the Islamic State's religious nature, he said, are rooted in an "interfaith-Christian-nonsense tradition."...

According to Haykel, the ranks of the Islamic State are deeply infused with religious vigor. Koranic quotations are ubiquitous. "Even the foot soldiers spout this stuff constantly," Haykel said... He regards the claim that the Islamic State has distorted the texts of Islam as preposterous, sustainable only through willful ignorance. "People want to absolve Islam," he said. "It's this 'Islam is a religion of peace' mantra. As if there is such a thing as 'Islam'! It's what Muslims do, and how they interpret their texts." Those texts are shared by all Sunni Muslims, not just the Islamic State. "And

these guys have just as much legitimacy as anyone else."

All Muslims acknowledge that Muhammad's earliest conquests were not tidy affairs, and that the laws of war passed down in the Koran and in the narrations of the Prophet's rule were calibrated to fit a turbulent and violent time. In Haykel's estimation, the fighters of the Islamic State are authentic throwbacks to early Islam and are faithfully reproducing its norms of war. This behavior includes a number of practices that modern Muslims tend to prefer not to acknowledge as integral to their sacred texts. "Slavery, crucifixion, and beheadings are not something that freakish [jihadists] are cherry-picking from the medieval tradition," Haykel said. Islamic State fighters "are smack in the middle of the medieval tradition and are bringing it wholesale into the present day."...

The Koran specifies crucifixion as one of the only punishments permitted for enemies of Islam. The tax on Christians finds clear endorsement in the Surah Al-Tawba, the Koran's ninth chapter, which instructs Muslims to fight Christians and Jews "until they pay the jizya with willing submission, and feel themselves subdued." The Prophet, whom all Muslims consider exemplary, imposed these rules and owned slaves.

Leaders of the Islamic State have taken emulation of Muhammad as strict duty, and have revived traditions that have been dormant for hundreds of years. "What's striking about them is not just the literalism, but also the seriousness with which they read these texts," Haykel said. "There is an assiduous, obsessive seriousness that Muslims don't normally have."

... when the Islamic State began enslaving people, even some of its supporters balked. Nonetheless, the caliphate has continued to embrace slavery and crucifixion without apology. "We will conquer your Rome, break your crosses, and enslave your women," Adnani, the spokesman, promised in one of his periodic valentines to the West. "If we do not reach that time, then our children and grandchildren will reach it, and they will sell your sons as slaves at the slave market." ...

Muslims can say that slavery is not legitimate now, and that crucifixion is wrong at this historical juncture. Many say precisely this. But they cannot condemn slavery or crucifixion outright without contradicting the Koran and the example of the Prophet. "The only principled ground that the Islamic State's opponents could take is to say that certain core texts and traditional teachings of Islam are no longer valid," Bernard Haykel says. That really would be an act of apostasy.

Wood meets an Australian jihadist in Melbourne:

In November, I traveled to Australia to meet Musa Cerantonio, a 30-year-old man whom Neumann and other researchers had identified as one of the two most important "new spiritual authorities" guiding foreigners to join the Islamic State....

Cerantonio—a big, friendly man with a bookish demeanor—told me he blanches at beheading videos. He hates seeing the violence, even though supporters of the Islamic State are required to endorse it. (He speaks out, controversially among jihadists, against suicide bombing, on the grounds that God forbids suicide; he differs from the Islamic State on a few other points as well.)...

Cerantonio explained the joy he felt when [Islamic State leader] Baghdadi was declared the caliph on June 29... "I was in a hotel [in the Philippines], and I saw the declaration on television," he told me. "And I was just amazed, and I'm like, Why am I stuck here in this bloody room?"...

The caliphate, Cerantonio told me, is not just a political entity but also a vehicle for salvation.... Cerantonio nodded gravely. "I would go so far as to say that Islam has been reestablished" by the caliphate.

And Wood offers some small hope:

Properly contained, the Islamic State is likely to be its own undoing. No country is its ally, and its ideology ensures that this will remain the case. The land it controls, while expansive, is mostly uninhabited and poor. As it stagnates or slowly shrinks, its claim that it is the engine of God's will and the agent of apocalypse will weaken, and fewer believers will arrive. And as more reports of misery within it leak out, radical Islamist movements elsewhere will be discredited: No one has tried harder to implement strict Sharia by violence. This is what it looks like.

Even so, the death of the Islamic State is unlikely to be quick, and things could still go badly wrong: if the Islamic State obtained the allegiance of Al Qaeda—increasing, in one swoop, the unity of its base—it could wax into a worse foe than we've yet seen.

Reading them recently reminded me of so many memories of my own childhood and the myriad delights of growing up without so many gadgets. "We were a happy mob, delightfully happy, in a contented, grateful kind of way. As for me, I sometimes loved being alone, and spent hours wandering around the farm just marvelling at things: how a calf sometimes came to be born with the same markings as its mother; why certain clouds predicted winds, others rain, and others fine weather; how a ewe always knew her own lamb in the midst of dozens of others just by smelling it. Things like that fascinated me.

There was so much for me to think about, and so many things that filled me with a delight so intense that it amounted to almost emotional rapture, (like) rubbing my cheek against the smooth leather of a well-worn saddle; lying on my back, one eye closed, looking at a tiny circle of sky through a straw; pressing my ear as close as possible to the earth to hear sounds that didn't make a noise; and at dusk, after the men had been shearing, wandering through the shed where they had been

working, breathing the warm, heavy smell of wool intermingled with the clean, fresh tang of tar."

"We (my sister Ann and I) loved lying there in the dark listening to the plopping and splashing of the big fat raindrops finding their way into the

various basins and dishes placed around our rooms. Each basin and each dish gave off a different plink or plash, and we thrilled to the sound of drops that plopped on the waterproof coats spread over our beds with a dull thud before dissolving into little rivers, the course of which we could control, just by moving our feet or knees this way or that. We had to be careful not to step in the many dishes and basins spread all through the house to catch the drops as they came splashing through the roof.

For us, those nights were full of unusual sounds and music. The steady trickling or sudden gushing of water in our one big galvanized tank, the easing and groaning of our old house settling under its burden of rain, and the kitchen floorboards talking to themselves in the dark made our bed seem ever so comfortable, ever so cozy.

Summer nights, too, had their pleasures. Then Ann and I loved to wiggle ourselves into a position where we could each see, through a hole in the roof, a star twinkling at us from the velvety sky overhead. it wouldn't matter how mad we were with our teacher, our brothers and sisters, or our schoolmates, a few minutes of star-gazing and wondering about the magnitude of things beyond our understanding would quickly dispel any crankiness we may have been hugging to our hurt little singlets for hours past."




Joe goes back to Obama's house, looks at the leaky pipe, checks his new rate chart and says, "Let's see, this will now cost you \$21,000."

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CHRISTIAN INVENTOR R.G. LETOURNEAU - By David Cloud - February 4, 2015

ROBERT G. LETOURNEAU (1888-1969) was business magnate and philanthropist and an inventor who held nearly 300 patents.

Known as "the Dean of earthmoving," LeTourneau is considered "to have been the world's greatest inventor of earthmoving and materials handling equipment." LeTourneau had a natural genius for engineering. Machines designed and built by LeTourneau represented nearly 70% of the earthmoving equipment and engineering vehicles used by the Allied forces during World War II.


He invented the earth mover, electric wheel, tree crusher, log picker, bulldozer, airplane tow, the air crane, the two-wheeled tractor called "Tournapull," and the first mobile offshore oil platform. He developed low-pressure, heavy-duty rubber tires for heavy equipment.

In 1953, LeTourneau sold his entire earthmoving equipment line to the Westinghouse Air Brake Company. Five years later, he developed new equipment based of his electric wheel drive invention called the "wheel hub motor."

LeTourneau was a dedicated Christian and a Bible believer. When he incurred a large debt during the Great Depression, he remained true to his Christian principles.

"The surety company that had backed RG LeTourneau on the construction job that posted the \$100,000 loss was going to see to it that RG paid them back every penny owed. So on LeTourneau's next job, the surety company demanded RG work on Sundays or else they would foreclose on his business, his house, everything. Since RG's business partner was God, he gave the problem to God to solve. The owner of the surety company, Mr. Hall, boarded a train to officially shut LeTourneau down, but upon arrival to the job site the next day, something miraculous occurred. The surety man had a change of heart and allowed RG to continue.

"Although the job was completed without working on Sundays, RG was still deep in debt. He was able to buy some time with his creditors by committing to improve his financial reporting. The surety company installed an accountant named Mr. Frost to reign in the books. What Mr. Frost found was worse than he had originally expected.



"Meanwhile, RG had skipped his yearly missions pledge the year before so he was committed to making good with the Lord. He told Mr. Frost that he had pledged \$5,000 to his church for missions. Mr. Frost couldn't believe it. RG was so far behind, even thinking of donating to the Lord was out of the question. Mr. Frost didn't realize who RG was partners in business with. Unbelievably, the business managed to stay afloat and the missions commitment was paid in full that year. Then, his business hit a breakthrough" ("RG LeTourneau: Earthmoving Innovator," GiantsforGod.com).

After LeTourneau turned his attention to manufacturing earthmoving equipment and was becoming financially successful, he and his wife Evelyn determined to give 90% of their income to the Lord. LeTourneau was fond of remarking, "It's not how much of my money I give to God, but how much of God's money I keep for myself."

The LeTourneaus had a heart to reach the world with the gospel of Jesus Christ, and they had a special interest in youth people. Evelyn started Sunday Schools and youth camps.

Overcoming his fear of public speaking, LeTourneau traveled widely giving his testimony and challenging his fellow Christians to do more for the Lord.

He founded LeTourneau University, a private Christian institution in Texas, which offers degrees in engineering, aeronautical sciences, and liberal arts.

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





What Christians Should Know About Rock Music



I must admit that I am a bit of a Geek. I love to tinker with computers. I had the occasion of two drives breaking down at almost the same time a few years ago on a machine I had built. I found some of the paperwork that had the guarantee written. It said that the drives were guaranteed for five years. Great. But to be able to get them repaired or replaced, I needed to find the receipt, a registration card, and the original packing. I had actually saved the original packing, but the rest of the required items were long gone. So much for that guarantee.

But there is a word that is used in the New Testament that speaks of a guarantee that is far beyond anything that a man could ever give.

This word is one of the more interesting words of the New Testament and is found only three times in the Bible. It was used only by the Apostle Paul. It is found in the following verses:

2 Corinthians 1:22 Who hath also sealed us, and given the earnest of the Spirit in our hearts.

2 Corinthians 5:5 Now He that hath wrought us for the selfsame thing is God, Who also hath given unto us the earnest of the Spirit.

Ephesians 1:14 Which is the earnest of our inheritance until the redemption of the purchased possession, unto the praise of His glory.

All three times the word is translated as EARNEST. The Greek word is the word ARRABON. Thayer's defines ARRABON as "an earnest; money which in purchases is given as a pledge or down payment that the full amount will subsequently be paid." Each time ARRABON is used, it is used in the same context concerning the Holy Spirit of God.

Most are familiar with the meaning of that word in light of what is termed "earnest money" today. It was used in the secular world of Rome in the same manner. The purchaser would deposit and make a down payment when a bargain was struck over an item or service he wanted to purchase.

It was considered to be the first installment of payment. It was the pledge. It was the guarantee that the rest of the money would follow soon. Sometimes it was called the "caution money." If the purchase was not carried out, the earnest money was forfeited.

The word was used very commonly in the secular world concerning business documents and agreements. For instance, there is an account in the papyri of a woman that was selling a cow who received an earnest of one thousand drachmae. Another instance was of an earnest that was paid to a troop of dancing girls that were hired to dance at a festival, and the rest was to be paid after their performance. There is even an instance of a man who was known as the "mouse catcher" who was given earnest money to catch mice that were pregnant. The document said that "he was to get on with the job of catching the mice while the going was good."

When the word came into use in the New Testament by Paul, Paul always uses it in conjunction with the Holy Spirit. God's gift of the Holy Spirit to us is the guarantee, the pledge, He is the advance preview of the life which we will live one day when we come into presence of God.

Think about what we have been promised. The Holy Spirit is the guarantee of the new body, and everything about our glorification in the future. We do not have to find paperwork, receipts, or documents signed and written by men to have that guarantee realized like we would for something we might buy today and it breaks tomorrow. It is all in the hands of the One to Whom we have given our very spirits.

Understand that Paul was speaking out of a Jewish background. To the Jew, the Holy Spirit was thought about in two ways in the life of a believer. First of all, it was through the Holy Spirit that God spoke to men. Often we read that about the prophets speaking because the Spirit of the Lord was upon them. Then secondly, the Holy

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Spirit, dwelling in a man's heart, enabled a man to recognize God's truth when he heard it.

God's Spirit worked from the outside to bring a person to the truth. Then He would work from the inside so as to empower them to recognize truth. Thus, the Spirit revealed truth and was the standard of truth.

With that in mind, the giving to us of the earnest of the Spirit always spoke of that which would be greater than we in our mortal bodies and minds can imagine. For now, our knowledge is imperfect. Yes, we have the perfectly completed Scriptures, and the Spirit of God reveals to us that truth. But there are still things that God has not revealed to us in this finite body. One day we will no longer have imperfect knowledge.

It will be made full. Consider our joy. For now, it is essentially imperfect. But the earnest of the Spirit of God

is the pledge that we will have the perfect joy of heaven. No more will there be tears of sorrow, but the complete joy of eternity. One day we will possess the full future possession of our salvation. We have the earnest now of it

But we do not have bodies like unto Christ's body. One day, because of the earnest, the guarantee of the Holy Spirit now, there is so much more to come. The guarantee is by God Himself.

Unlike a human earnest, there is no way that guarantee can be voided, nor can it be nullified because of time, or loss of any of the original paperwork. There are also no forfeitures of anything, meaning that once we have the earnest of the Holy Spirit, it is set forever.

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THERE AREN'T MANY LEFT, FUNDAMENTALISTS, THAT IS.

Most of them now call themselves "conservative evangelicals".

"Fundamentalism" has become almost a swear word. That's strange, isn't it, because there's nothing we like better than a doctor who knows the fundamentals of anatomy, physiology, and medicine or an accountant who knows the fundamentals of finance and investments?

I am partial to mechanics who know the fundamentals of engineering, metallurgy, heat exchange, and lubrication. I prefer pharmacists who know the fundamentals of chemistry to alchemists who mix toe of frog with eye of newt, don't you?

Just so, when I sit and listen to a Christian preacher, I want to know that he has the fundamentals of the Christian faith down pat. If he is unsure about even one foundational truth I am prone to go shopping for

someone who knows his Bible inside out and knows what he is talking about.

Fundamental Baptists are getting pretty thin on the ground. Be that as it may, there is an even greater wonder in the land.

SELECTIVE FUNDAMENTALISM IS NOW THE NORM AMONG THOSE WHO STILL CALL THEMSELVES "FUNDAMENTALISTS"-

If it were possible to gather all the Independent Baptist preachers that ever lived into one place (and keep them from fighting) long enough for them to write down their definitions of "fundamentalism", there would be at least fifty times as many definitions as there were preachers.

I like many of the older definitions of fundamentalism that I read. Good, godly men wrote them and preached them and did their best to live them.

But those days are past. We are living in a new generation, the age of the selective fundamentalist.

You won't talk long with most IB preachers these days before you perceive an eclectic spirit. (Whoa, Nelly! Run that one by us again.) The word "eclectic" was first used in the 1680s, and means, "not confined to or following any one model or system," originally in reference to ancient philosophers who selected doctrines from every system; from French eclectique (1650s), from Greek eklektikos "selective," literally "picking out," from eklektos "selected," from eklegein "pick out, select," from ek "out" (see ex-) + legein "gather, choose")

It means they have been picking and choosing which fundamentals are their favourites. Instead of diligently contending for "the faith which was once delivered to the saints" (Jude 3) the preferred option appears to be picking and choosing "what pleases me best."

One of our friends in South Texas used to take his pastor out to eat quite often. They always had to go to Luby's cafeteria where you could pick and choose from a limited menu. We've all been there, and enjoy the available options. But when I was a child, my mother didn't leave it to me to choose what I wanted to eat. If she had I would doubtless have eaten all the desert myself and left the beans and greens untouched. She chose for me, knowing what I needed and then made sure I ate the lot. I am glad she did.

So it MUST be for God's preachers. We are not to serve up for our congregations lollies and ice cream and cake. We are to "teach them all things whatsoever the Lord has commanded us" (Matt, 28:20). We are to "declare unto them all the counsel of God."

Say, have you noticed how the word "all" has shrunk over the past decade or two. It is not only the Calvinists who preach that "all" means "some". Fundamentalists also, of every spot and stripe, now pick and choose what they think their congregations should hear.

Whatever happened to the old Ironsides that fired volley after volley from the pulpit on every text and topic?

I remember hearing preachers boldly proclaiming Bible truths that put the fear of God in our hearts and left us cowering at the altar for fear He would strike us dead that minute. Those old preachers left us with the impression that if we didn't want that kind of preaching we could go elsewhere. Soft soap and cotton candy were not marketed from those pulpits. The balm of Gilead was available, but only after a good dose of fire and brimstone!!!

Correct me if I am wrong, but for some years I have gotten the impression that many pastors preach "ear tickler" sermons. They preach what they like to hear and what their people will enjoy hearing, not what the Lord commands them to preach.

Many great theological themes, much sound doctrine goes begging and is NEVER touched because "it might offend" or drive away an unsaved visitor. Sermons on Hell, the Great White Throne, the Lake of Fire, Holiness, Abstinence from all alcoholic beverages, and a hundred more are seldom heard from our pulpits.

"Twelve Steps to Lukewarmness" and "Flirting With Wolves" would be real crowd-pleasers so that's what we hear at Lukewarm Baptist Church.

EXAMPLES OF SELECTIVE FUNDAMENTALISTS -

Have a look around and you'll discover the eclectic preachers most places:

There's Bro. ___ _____, who is a true fundamentalist when it comes to Creation, but very neo, almost modernist, when it comes to the Rapture. There's Dr. _____, who is ever so fundamental on the Great Commission, but Emergent when it comes to music. • There's Rev. _____, who is as fundamental as you can get on evangelism, but as ecumenical as the Pope when it comes to preaching II Cor. 6:14 - 7:1. Then there is Pastor ______, who is as winsome as Barnabas himself, but avoids the doctrine of Eternal Punishment for sin. • And of course, there is the Editor of the _ paper, who is ever so sound on New Testament church planting, but a total sceptic when it comes to repentance. And don't neglect sister ___ can discern error at 1000 yards, but shakes her head at the verses on loving her enemies.

 The list would be incomplete with mentioning Dr. _____ who wrote a scholarly book

on Inspiration, but daily burns incense at the

Westcott/Hort altar, and laughs out loud at

the doctrine of Preservation.

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HOW DO PASTORS LEARN TO BE SELECTIVE FUNDAMENTALISTS? -

Pastors learn eclecticism the same way Solomon did. He was a fundamentalist when it came to his Davidic lineage, rock-solid when it came to prayer, straight as a gun barrel when it came to worship, and the building of the temple, perfectly orthodox in his grasp of the love of God, and solid gold on the sovereignty of God, but he had his weak spots, bulls-eyes of vulnerability for the Devil to shoot at.

He loved and married many wives who knew not the Lord.

Nehemiah 13:26 "Did not Solomon king of Israel sin by these things? yet among many nations was there no king like him, who was beloved of his God, and God made him king over all Israel: nevertheless even him did outlandish women cause to sin."

I wondered for years why he would directly disobey God's word on the subject.

Deuteronomy 17:17 "Neither shall he multiply wives to himself, that his heart turn not away: neither shall he greatly multiply to himself silver and gold."

Deuteronomy 7:3-4 "Neither shalt thou make marriages with them; thy daughter thou shalt not give unto his son, nor his daughter shalt thou take unto thy son. For they will turn away thy son from following me, that they may serve other gods: so will the anger of the LORD be kindled against you, and destroy thee suddenly."

I wondered until I read 2 Chronicles 8:11

" And Solomon brought up the daughter of Pharaoh out of the city of David unto the house that he had built for her: for he said, My wife shall not dwell in the house of David king of Israel, because the places are holy, whereunto the ark of the LORD hath come."

Then I saw that Solomon leaned unto his own understanding and rationalised that it would be permissible in this one area to be a selective fundamentalist, "My house must be holy, but for political advantage, the women I choose to marry can be pagans. I will, therefore, be a real fundamentalist when it comes to my house being set apart for God, but a selective fundamentalist when it comes to the command of God not to marry outside the faith."

And we all know what Solomon's selective fundamentalism did to him, to his family and to his nation.

WHAT ARE THE RESULTS OF SELECTIVE FUNDAMENTALISM? -

We are presently observing an awful reaping of seed sown in years gone by. In my childhood I observed IB pastors sowing weed seeds by practicing the ethics of a godless world. One pastor used church funds to buy for his family an appliance he wanted and was asked to leave the church. He moved across town and started another church, and for years concealed the fact that he owned it as a business until the tax department caught up with him.

In my teens I watched pastors happily "stealing sheep" from other pastors and cheating to win in baseball games against their own teens. In my twenties I met pastors that I later discovered to be living in adultery. (Do you see the trend here?) I saw political skullduggery in high places.

If it were not for the harmful effects (on the author) I believe that I could write a book titled *The Villains of Church History*, and populate the text with Baptists alone.

Selective fundamentalism has carried its passengers from indifferent ethics to sleazy morals to man pleasing preaching to anaemic theology to weak-kneed worship, and finally, to teetering on the brink of Emergent methodology (I would have said Emergent theology, but I'm not so sure the emergents have one.) Bro. David Cloud says he thinks most IB churches will be emergent in 10 years' time. I disagree. He is too optimistic. It will be five years for most pastors.

Selective Fundamentalism has become the default mindset for IB pastors, at least for most of us.

IS THERE A REMEDY FOR SELECTIVE FUNDAMENTALISM?

The remedy for IB eclecticism is biblicism. Biblicism is the simple commitment to all that God has revealed in His Word. I was taught in college that that is what fundamentalism is, but after half a century in Christ, I perceive that fundamentalism, as a movement and a mindset, was never totally committed to Scripture. From the first, it encompassed men of such varied beliefs that, if they would work together to fight modernism, they must adopt the approach called *Unum Necessarium*, "In Essentials Unity, In Non-essentials, Liberty, In all Things Love."

The quote is often ascribed to Zinzendorf and the Moravians, but it actually originated with Marco Antonio de Dominis (1560-1624) (and was first spoken) in 1617. He was Catholic bishop in Italy, until he sided with the Archbishop of Venice in a fight against the pope and was forced to flee for his life to England.

It is doubtful if any of the early fundamentalists would have admitted to believing in *Unum Necessarium*, but nevertheless, they practiced it in their deliberations as to what was fundamental and what was not. Pedobaptists, Calvinists, Armenians, chiliasts and non-chiliasts combined with a dozen shades of discordant beliefs and joined hands in the belief that an artificial unity was better than none.

I always wonder what would have happened if a little red haired, freckle faced chap had stood up and shouted, "Men, we must be biblicists! We must preach the whole counsel of God without fear or favour!!! If any man among us is not already doing that, if any man is not hewing to the line, then he is tying one hand behind his

back, and will prove to be less than useless in the battle against modernism!!!"

A WORD OF WARNING!

When any man determines to be a simple biblicist he discovers 1) That strict denominationalists will immediately cry out for his dismissal. 2) That many whom he thought to be his closest friends will drift away to be seen no more. 3) That biblicism is not a Movement, but is the individual man's walk with God. 4) And last, he will find that there are more biblicists than he ever suspected.

Oh, one more thing. There is amazing liberty in being a biblicist!
