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

ast week I read Bro. Cloud's article on *Contemporary Praise Music and the Internet*. He wrote as follows:

TECHNOLOGY GIVES US ACCESS TO THE AUTHORS AND COMPOSERS OF CCM

"We are living in the age of end-time technology, which means that one can no longer use songs and hymns without the listeners being able to come into communication with the authors with great ease. Whereas even 30 years ago, it was difficult to contact and be influenced by authors of Christian music, that has changed dramatically with the Internet.

Today if people in a Bible-believing church hear songs by Jack Hayford or MercyMe or Graham Kendrick or Stuart Townend or Darlene Zschech or Keith Getty, songs heard in "adapted form" in many Bible-believing churches, they can easily search for that group or individual on the web and come into intimate contact with these people -- not only in contact with their music (typically played in "real" rock & roll style as opposed to the watered-down soft-rock ballad versions performed in churches that are only beginning to dabble with contemporary praise music), but also in contact with their ecumenical/charismatic/separatist hating/one-world church philosophy.

MAKING FRIENDS WITH THE BRIDGE BUILDERS -

Let's say someone hears the choir perform "In Christ Alone" or "The Power of the Cross" by the Gettys. They like the music and decide to check them out on the web. They come across the Gettys rocking out at their concerts, and begin to question their church's stand against rock music. They see the Gettys associating with anyone and everyone and begin to question biblical separation. "The Gettys seem so sincere and Christ-loving; maybe I've been too hard-nosed in my Christianity; maybe the separatist stance is all wrong; perhaps I should lighten up." They come across Keith Getty's July 2013 interview with Assist Ministries and decide to listen to what the man has to say. They hear Getty speak highly of Bono and C.S. Lewis, so they decide to take a look at these people, and by so doing they begin to question fundamental Bible doctrines.

After time, through the influence of the Gettys, the soul who was once a content member of a Bible-believing church, raising his children in a Bible-believing path, is on the high road to the emerging church and the children and grandchildren will end up who knows where. The same could be said for the influence of Townend or Kendrick or MercyMe or Zschech or hundreds of other prominent contemporary worship musicians, because they hold the same philosophy and represent the same bridge to spiritual danger.

PASTORS AND SONGWRITERS WHO USED TO CALL THEMSELVES "FUNDAMENTALISTS" NOW DEFEND THE USE OF CCM -

Men such as Paul Chappell and Clarence Sexton and Ron Hamilton, who should know better but who are defending the use of contemporary praise music either in word or by example, will answer to God for the souls that cross the bridges they are building to the dangerous world that is represented by this music.

THE ORIGINS OF THE TERM "BRIDGE BUILDERS" -

I noted Bro. Cloud's use of the term "Bridge Builders". This description did not originate with Bible preachers who oppose Praise and Worship CCM music. It's not our terminology. It is the terminology of Amy Grant, one of the pioneers of "Crossover Music." Amy Grant made her debut when she was 17 years old. She is now 52. An article (from Wikipedia) on Crossover music comments that she was the first Christian artist to build a bridge between sacred and secular music.

"The term "crossing over" is used to describe when an artist who had started predominantly in Christian markets starts receiving mainstream success. The first major artist crossover was by Amy Grant, with her 1985 album Unguarded and 1991 hit song Baby Baby" from the highest-selling Christian album Heart in Motion. The albums and single were distributed by a Christian label but received heavy play on pop radio stations and were chart-toppers on the Billboard charts."

She is quoted as saying, "I've felt like music should always welcome people. Faith and love should always be very welcoming. Unfortunately, the church has not always been very good at bridge building, but I think because my personal feeling has always been, hey, the table's set, the food's laid out, come eat, get filled up--hopefully that's why everybody feels welcome." - Amy Grant

THERE ARE NO ONE WAY BRIDGES!!!

It is impossible for Christian musicians to "build bridges" to those whose morals and values agree with the pop music world without secular, pop musicians using the same bridges to export their morals and message to the churches.

Where has Amy Grant travelled after crossing the bridge she built to a world without Christ? I decided to type into a search engine Amy's name and see what came up. Years ago, I read a report that told of her going nude on a beach, and then someone told of her marriage breakdown, and another report said she had posed for a pornographic photo shoot. AMY GRANT HAS NOT TRAVELLED ALONE! -

Her decision to sing music that a lost world would love has been copied by countless other musicians (as Bro. Cloud has documented in the book and video mentioned above.) Sadly, pastors all over the world are discovering that their teens are being seduced to cross bridges that didn't even exist a generation or two ago. There are bridges to Rome, bridges to Las Vegas, bridges to Hollywood, Bridges to Nashville, and bridges to Wall Street. Some years ago I was driving along the Texas/Mexico border near Laredo. It had been years since I was in the area, so I made a wrong turn and ended up at the new bridge across the Rio Grande River. When we lived in South Texas there was a little two lane bridge there, but now it is an eight lane maxi-freeway! Just so, the tiny, narrow plank bridges into the abominable moral and doctrinal sewers of a Christless world have grown into maxi-freeways of heresy and immorality that are aimed at destroying our churches!

THE BRIDGE TO LESBOS -

It is thought that the island called Lesbos, off the shores of Greece was populated by immigrants from Thessaly as long ago as 800 BC. Its reputation as the origin of lesbianism dates back to a Greek female poet named Sappho, around 630 BC. The word itself, "lesbian" is of recent usage, but is commonly thought to agree with the morality of the island's inhabitants.

lesbian (adj.) 1590s, "pertaining to the island of Lesbos," from Latin *Lesbius*, from Greek *lesbios* "of Lesbos," Greek island in northeastern Aegean Sea (the name originally may have meant "wooded"), home of Sappho, great lyric poet whose erotic and romantic verse embraced women as well as men, hence meaning "relating to homosexual relations between women" (1890; *lesbianism* in this sense is attested from 1870) and the noun, first recorded 1925. Before this, the principal figurative use (common in 17c.) was*lesbian rule* (c.1600) a mason's rule of lead, of a type used on Lesbos, which could be bent to fit the curves of a molding; hence, "pliant morality or judgment." from *Online Etymology Dictionary*

"One of the great Greek lyrists and few known female poets of the ancient world, Sappho was born some time between 630 and 612 BC. She was an aristocrat who married a prosperous merchant, and she had a daughter named Cleis. Her wealth afforded her with the opportunity to live her life as she chose, and she chose to spend it studying the arts on the isle of Lesbos.

In the seventh century BC, Lesbos was a cultural center. Sappho spent most her time on the island, though she also traveled widely throughout Greece. She was exiled for a time because of political activities in her family, and she spent this time in Sicily. By this time she was known as a poet, and the residents of Syracuse were so honored by her visit that they erected a statue to her.

Her style was sensual and melodic; primarily songs of love, yearning, and reflection. Most commonly the target of her affections was female, often one of the many women sent to her for education in the arts. She nurtured these women, wrote poems of love and adoration to them, and when they eventually left the island to be married, she composed their wedding songs. That Sappho's poetry was not condemned in her time for its homoerotic content (though it was disparaged by scholars in later centuries) suggests that perhaps love between women was not persecuted then as it has been in more recent times. Especially in the last century, Sappho has become so synonymous with woman-love that two of the most popular words to describe female homosexuality-lesbian and sapphic have derived from her." http://www.sappho.com/poetry/sappho.html

Amy Grant's Long Attachment to Gays and Lesbians-

Amy Grant actively, knowingly built a bridge to the world by performing music that purposely avoided confronting its immorality and narcissism. By singing songs that reached out to the sensuality that gays and lesbians are addicted to, she implied to them that they were welcome in her world and in her religion.

The bridge to the world is always a two way street. It is not possible to smilingly give wicked men a nonconfrontational message and not expect them to carry their worldview, their mindset, their morals, and their gay marriages across the bridge you built and into your world. If Amy had been converted to Christ and taught the Scriptures she would have heard the verse, "Be not deceived. Evil communications corrupt good manners." (I Cor. 15:33).

Amy built a bridge to Lesbos. So they came in droves across the bridge into Amy Grant's world.

From the interview above, we read these excerpts:

"You came from a fairly strict religious upbringing, but it sounds like there's been an evolution in the way you see people.

Well, I don't know. When you say strict, that's interesting. What do you mean by that? (Laughs) I mean, we went to church every Sunday morning, every Sunday night, every Wednesday night.

You're right. I should say diligently religious.

Yeah. I remember when we moved to Texas and my parents went to this really, I guess, conservative church - a Church of Christ - and something incredible was happening within that church community. I remember seeing this transformation in my mom and dad. I was old enough to remember that. What I remember about our home after that was that it was welcoming ... to everybody.

Did you ever feel that you had to reconcile your Christian faith with your acceptance of homosexuality?

That's not my life experience. In the same way, if you put my shoes on, you would go, "I thought this experience was going to be one way and it was totally different." None of us has any idea what somebody's life experience is like.

Do you remember the first gay person you knew? Did you have a close gay friend?

Absolutely. But my first: maybe college. Someone might have just seemed theatrical or, I don't know, effeminate, but when I was in high school -I graduated in '78 - I had friends in high school who eventually said, "I'm living a gay lifestyle," but they didn't say it then. People were very private about their sexuality, period. Maybe not everywhere, but I just don't remember, "I'm exploring this, I'm exploring that."

When did you first know you had a gay fan base?

Probably by the time I was 18.

From photos I've seen and conversations I've heard, you seem to have established some close relationships with people in the Gay Friends of Amy Grant group on Facebook over the years. Can you describe your relationship with them? When you've done something for a long time, there is a great familiarity that comes over the years. I will say that I have a couple of friends that I made - just because they came to shows for a long time - and I figure we must have some things in common because, of all the music we're all attracted to, at least we share this music in common.

I recall seeing you perform with Melissa Etheridge for Lifetime's "Women Rock!" special in 2000 and thinking, as a teenager struggling with his sexuality, "She's performing with an openly lesbian performer; she's throwing her gay fans a bone."

You know what's so interesting, even when I was discovering my own sexuality and meeting people that had a different experience, I didn't categorize then, and I don't categorize right now. It makes me realize that I don't have any idea of what it would feel like every moment of my life to go somewhere and feel judged.

So how do you respond to people when they ask you about your feelings on gay marriage? In the same way that I did not tell one person who I voted for. I don't. I never talk about anything like that. I did tell Vince (Gill, her husband) the day after the election. (Laughs) But I think my response is, I have had so many occasions in my life where I have felt really strongly about something - but that feeling has changed. Those feelings change about different situations, and so because I'm a public person and because I want always to bring people together - I really do say this is a world that's unfamiliar to me and I am always trying to observe with compassion."

What Hillsong, Paul Chappell, Robert Bakss, and men of like mind do not realise is that, in their love and use of


Contemporary Praise and Worship Music, they are building bridges to Lesbos so that the sodomites of our generation can feel at home in our churches. These churches will find it more and more difficult to preach on God's judgment on Sodom, or on Hell being a literal place of eternal punishment.

BECAUSE WE DID NOT WARN OUR PEOPLE AGAINST BUILDING BRIDGES TO LESBOS!

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THE WORDS GOD CHOSE TO USE - by Pastor Tom Hill



As from the beginning, and through time, the simplicity of the gospel remains under attack by the enemy. It is not unusual to hear presentations of what some refer to as "the gospel" that, in one way or another, pervert it and make it of none effect. There are those who say the gospel is "inviting Jesus into your heart." Others say, "just believe." Some believe that a belief in God or Jesus is enough to bring about the forgiveness of sin. Still, there are those who believe that the gospel includes some sort of human work, such as baptism, so as to say that Jesus did not do enough on the cross, and we have to help some how with the payment for our sin. Then there are those who will present Jesus Christ as the Savior, and declare that we must have faith in Him, and yet they leave out repentance. The Bible is so very clear about salvation, but men have changed the truth of the gospel so as to make it more palatable to mankind.

This became of great and grave concern of the Apostle Paul while he was in Corinth, so he wrote to the churches of Galatia. He said, "I marvel that ye are so soon removed from Him that called you into the grace of Christ unto another gospel: Which is not another; but there be some that trouble you, and would pervert the gospel of Christ." (Gal. 1:6,7) Those who believed that salvation was the sum of faith + works, known as the Judiazers, had come into the Galatian churches and had perverted the gospel.

That is an interesting passage of Scripture that warrants a consideration of some of the words that the Holy Spirit chose to use. The word for REMOVED is the word *METATITHEMI*, which means "to transpose two things, one of which is put in place of the other." Breaking the word down further, we would understand it has the thought of "to desert". It came to be used as a military

word that spoke of a soldier that left the army, that is, one who had gone AWOL. Still further, the word has a reflexive quality about it that tells us that the false teachers twisted the truth and that the people were accountable for their own actions of literally "transferring themselves away". They transferred themselves away from the Person of Jesus Christ, to something else. Paul says unto ANOTHER GOSPEL.

The word ANOTHER is used two different ways in v. 6 and v. 7. This is a word that should be looked up in lexicon, Greek word study, or Greek concordance any time it appears in the New Testament. The first time that Paul uses "ANOTHER," it is the word *HETEROS*. HETEROS simply means *"another of a different kind."* You transferred yourselves away from Christ to another *"of a different kind"* of gospel.

Verse 7 continues the thought, "which is not ANOTHER." The word ANOTHER this time is the word ALLOS, which means "another of the same kind." The "gospel" you transferred yourselves to was not a gospel of the same kind, but you went AWOL to a gospel of a different kind. Quite simply, beloved, Paul is saying that they left the gospel of grace, to a gospel of works. That message to which you went is not the gospel. That "gospel" to which you have gone is simply more bondage.

There were those actively troubling the churches of Galatia. The word for TROUBLE is *TARASSO*, which means *"to agitate, to cause inward commotion."* These evil false teachers knew what they were doing. They attacked Paul, and his apostleship, so as to imply that he was wrong

about the gospel, and then they pressured the Galatians to change their beliefs. By this, Paul says, the message had now completely changed – "and would pervert the gospel of Christ." The word PERVERT – METASTREPHO means "to desire to turn about or turn around." The Greek literally says, "desiring to turn about the gospel of the Christ." Deliberately, they were changing grace to legalism.

That which is declared in the world of religion today is this "another of a different kind of gospel." Remember that religion is man reaching up to God through his works, but Bible truth is God coming down to man in the Person of Jesus Christ, who offers eternal life through His grace alone. It is not the gospel, for it is full of the error of salvation by works. Or man centered religion leaves out part of the truth of the gospel. That goes back to Cain, the firstborn of Adam and Eve, who chose works over faith. Cain certainly had a way that seemed right to him. But the Scriptures declare in **Proverbs 14:12**, "There is a way which seemeth right unto a man, but the end thereof are the ways of death." Cain and countless others placed their hope in that "different kind of gospel" have already discovered their mistake and will soon experience the second death in the lake of fire because of that choice.

That should remind us of our responsibility to others in telling them the gospel, and how to be born from above not as man has stated it, but as the Almighty has declared it in His word.

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BOAZ, "MR. RIGHT" - Dr. Thomas M. Strouse

How did Naomi and Ruth know that Boaz was "Mr. Right" for Ruth? After all, Naomi laid out a strategy for Ruth to pursue, and Ruth willing said, *"All that thou sayest unto me I will do"* (Ruth 3:5). Before considering an answer to this practical query, several factors must be considered.

First, the great overarching motivational agenda for all women in ancient times was not merely to have children, but to have a male offspring in hopes of mothering the Messiah. The Seed Promise (cf. Gen. 3:15) that Jehovah gave the sinful couple in the Garden was for Eve to give birth to their Saviour,¹ and hence Adam named his wife "Eve" (أَجَرُتُ),² indicating he had requisite faith in God's means of redemption. Because of the faith of Adam (and Eve), the LORD accepted their faith and covered them with the product of the first blood sacrifice (cf. Gen. 3:20-21). Subsequently, Eve thought her firstborn Cain was the incarnate Jehovah, saying literally, "I have begotten a man, even Jehovah."

This interpretation is confirmed in her later statement as Scripture stated, saying, "And Adam knew his wife again; and she bare a son, and called his name Seth: For God, said she, hath appointed me another seed instead of Abel, whom Cain slew" (Gen. 4:25). Eve, no doubt, told her daughters of this hope, who in turn told the women on Noah's ark, who in turn passed on this hope of having the Messiah to the nations represented in the Table of Nations (cf. Gen. 10:1 ff.). Thus, Daniel used the hapax legomena expression "the desire of women" (جَרֶבֶּהֶ םَרָשָׁרָ)³ as a periphrastic (roundabout way of speaking) construction referring to Christ the Messiah (cf. Dan. 11:37). In other words, the Antichrist will not regard the desire that women had (i.e., to birth the Messiah); he will be opposed to the ultimate product of this desire – Christ!

Second, the Scripture gives the record of four women in the Messiah's lineage who were highly motivated theologically to mate with a Jewish man in hopes of producing the Messiah (cf. Mt. 1:3-6). These women were Tamar (cf. Gen. 38), Rahab (cf. Josh. 2), Ruth (cf. Ruth 1-4), and Bathsheba (cf. II Sam. 11). Three of these women used unsavory methods (immorality or deception) to get into the messianic lineage, as God honored their faith and not their means. Ruth, with the same theological motivation of her soon-to-be mother-in-law Rahab, used aggressive but honorable means to pursue Boaz.

Third, the Christian perspective on interpreting Ruth and the Song of Solomon especially, must be built upon the truth found in Paul's letter to Titus, which states, "Unto the pure all things are pure: but unto them that are defiled



and unbelieving is nothing pure; but even their mind and conscience is defiled" (Tit. 1:15). In other words, a man's commentary on the Bible is really a commentary on the man. If the reader of Scripture sees impure and immoral behavior in passages of Ruth, he is reading in his wicked presuppositions. Scripture avers about the virtue of the woman Ruth, saying, "And now, my daughter, fear not; I will do to thee all that thou requirest: for all the city of my people doth know that thou art a virtuous woman" (Ruth 3:11).⁴

So why did Naomi eagerly propose her unusual plan⁵ and Ruth submissively accept it without question or hesitation? The women followed several biblical teachings and concluded Boaz was "Mr. Right" for Ruth.

1. Ruth met Boaz in the place of truth. She did not go back to Moab, but went to the geographical location of truth— Bethlehem Judah. The Messiah was promised through the man Judah (cf. Gen. 49:10) and in the Promised Land (cf. Mic. 5:2). In this dispensation, the Baptist assembly is the divinely-ordained place of truth to meet one's mate.

2. *Ruth honored her "mother."* As a grown woman, Ruth nevertheless submitted to her guardian's biblical advice (cf. also Ruth 1:16-17). Ruth probably was aware of the

SERMON FODDER -

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biblical truth of the Law, which stated, "Honour thy father and thy mother, as the LORD thy God hath commanded thee; that thy days may be prolonged, and that it may go well with thee, in the land which the LORD thy God giveth thee" (Dt. 5:16).

3. Ruth recognized that Boaz was spiritual. Boaz's tenor around everyone exuded spirituality. For instance, he greeted his workers with a beatitude from Jehovah (cf. Ruth 2:4). He commended Ruth for trusting in Jehovah (cf. Ruth 2:12).

4. Ruth realized that Boaz was single. She was interested in one who was a biblical candidate for marriage, and not in a divorcee (cf. Mk. 10:11-12; Rom. 7:2-3).

5. Ruth experienced that Boaz was considerate. She already knew that he was considerate of her needs before their relationship blossomed (cf. Ruth 2:8 ff.). She did not anticipate that she would have to change some inconsiderate man into becoming a gentleman after marriage!

6. Ruth knew that Boaz had means to support her. Since he was her kinsman or (Ruth 2:20; 3:2), this necessitated that he had met the requirements: he was a "near" relative (cf. Lev. 25:48); he was able (cf. Ruth 4:4-6); he was willing (cf. Ruth 4:6); and he could pay the price (cf. Lev. 25:26-27).⁶

7. Ruth appreciated that Boaz was mature and witty. Boaz did not identify himself with younger field workers (cf. Ruth 3:10), suggesting that he was older and more mature (his actions belied this perspective). He also punned to her as she did to him (cf. Ruth 2:10-11). They both enjoyed clever repartee.

The women considered that Boaz was "Mr. Right" for Ruth for the aforementioned reasons. Of course, Scripture confirms their choice as the biblical choice, based on biblical precepts (cf. Ruth 4:13-22; Mt. 1:5). Christian young people ought to follow this biblical example for the Lord's full blessing when looking for God's will in a spouse.

- ¹ The Apostle Paul confirmed this interpretation, saying, "And Adam was not deceived, but the woman being deceived was in the transgression. Notwithstanding she shall be saved in childbearing, if they continue in faith and charity and holiness with sobriety" (I Tim. 2:14-15).
- ² This is a redemptive pun on the word "living" (□.).

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
- ³ The Hebrew refers to "women's desire (to bear the Messiah)" and <u>not</u> to "a desire for women," as is often fallaciously taught.

- ⁵ The plan was unusual for the Western mind, but apparently it was an accepted biblical practice (cf. Dt. 25:5 ff.; Ezk. 16:8).




One graph (above) says it all, especially after I annotated it for climate news spike events.



Either I wasn't reading God right in His Word or God is not coming through on His promises." And I knew that wasn't true.

It was that experience that drove me into God's Word so deep I started reading people like R. C. Sproul and J. I. Packer and Jeremiah Burrows and John Owen and Jonathan Edwards and other contemporary authors - Dr. John MacArthur, there's so many. 

BENJAMIN BEDDOME pastored one church for 54 years. He wrote many excellent hymns, one a week for years and years. "The labours of this good man among his charge were unremitted and evangelical. He fed them with the finest of the wheat. No man in all his connections wrote more sermons, nor composed them with greater care; and this was true of him to the last weeks of his life. In most of his discourses the appreciation of a student and the ablility of a divine were visible. He frequently differed from the generality of preachers by being somewhat striking either in his text or in his method. If the passage were peculiar or abstruse, simplicity of illustration and familiarity in discussion characterised the sermon; or if his text were of the most familiar class, he distributed it with novelty, discussed it with genius, and seldom delivered a hackneyed discourse. Indeed, sermonising was so much his forte that at length, when knowledge had received maturity from years, and composition was familiarised by habit, he has been known, with a wonderful facility of the moment, to sketch his picture at the foot of the pulpit stairs, to colour it as he



was ascending, and, without turning his eyes from the canvas, in the same hour to give it all the finish of a master. One instance of this will be long remembered, which happened at a ministers meeting at Fairford, in Gloustershire. After public service began, his natural timidity, it seems, overcame his recollections. His text and his discourse, for he did not preach by notes, had left him: and in the way from the pew to the pulpit he leaned his head over the shoulder of the Rev. Mr. Davis, pastor of the place, and said, "Brother Davis, what must I preach from?" Mr. Davis, thinking he could not be at a loss, answered, "Ask no foolish queestions." This afforded him considerable relief. He turned immediately to Titus 3:9, "Avoid foolish questions," and he preached a remarkable methodical, correct, and useful discourse on it." ~ Excerpted from Baptist History by J. M. EDDY-TORIAL - WHEN THE AXE BEGINS TO BITE - By Bro. Buddy Smith

I have always been attracted to the book of Daniel, and especially the first six chapters.

Fifty years ago, my wise old pastor, A.V. Henderson, nailed me as I was going out the church door the night I surrendered my life to preach the gospel. He said, "I want you to preach Wednesday night week. Come to my study tomorrow afternoon after work and I will help you get started on a sermon."

(I have never been so frightened as I was that afternoon. Me, preach? Sure, I had responded to God's call and had walked the aisle, and my pastor had prayed with me, and had told the church that I was the first man (?) to surrender to preach under his ministry. And everyone in the building had come by after and shook my hand. But me preach? Maybe in a year or ten or twenty? But not NEXT week! Surely not.)

My preacher was of the old school. He believed that, if God called a man to preach, then he also gave him the ability to preach. It wasn't a matter of IQ or education or how many books he'd read. He believed that, if I had the call, I'd have the goods. There was no use beating about the bush. We might as well know now if the call was real or not.

When we met the next night, Bro. Henderson asked, "What do you want to preach about?" And by that time I knew. I said, "Daniel chapter 3."

I still have the notes. Somehow the Spirit of God had already taught me (in the week or two after my conversion) that Daniel chapter 3 was the account of Him saving those who trusted in Him, and that He would do the same for me.

But if I loved chapter 3 then, I think I love chapter 4 even more now. You see, chapter 4 tells of "When The Axe Began To Bite."

- It is the chapter that teaches that Success Is Dangerous!
- It is the chapter that teaches that Success Genders Pride!
- It is the chapter that teaches that God Always Resists Pride!
- It is the chapter that teaches that God Always Exalts The Humble!

The dream of the felling of the great tree demanded interpretation and Daniel alone had access to its secrets.

"The tree that thou sawest....It is thou, O king, that art grown and become strong: for thy greatness is grown, and reacheth unto heaven, and thy dominion to the end of the earth."



VERY FEW MEN SURVIVE THEIR OWN SUCCESS!

Nebuchadnezzar boasted of having built Babylon, "Is not this great Babylon, that I have built for the house of the kingdom by the might of my power, and for the honour of my majesty?"

Pride exaggerates its accomplishments, as did the king when he boasted of having built Babylon. The construction of Babylon took almost 2000 years. In all likelihood, Nebuchadnezzar never lifted one brick into place.

It sees its achievements as being superlative. He called the wicked city, "Mighty Babylon."

It ignores the contributions of others. Many kings and myriads of slaves had laboured to build the city.

It seeks all the glory for itself - No credit was shared with those who did the work.

It hardens its owner against every reproof. Daniel's brave counsel in verse 27 was ignored by the proud king.

It inevitably brings its owner down. "Hew down the tree! And cut off his branches! Shake off his leaves and scatter his fruit! Hew the tree down and destroy it!" So the watcher cried. "O king Nebuchadnezzar, to thee it is spoken; the kingdom is departed from thee!"

That is the felling of the tree.

WHEN THE AXE BEGAN TO BITE -

The axe actually began to bite long before the fall of Nebuchadnezzar's tree. God soon begins to hew every boy/man/tree down to the ground, no matter how many Axe strokes it takes. We seldom see all the strokes of the Heavenly Axeman in anyone's life but our own. We hear from afar the powerful cuts of God's Axe as He hews down a proud man, and are oft drawn to the site. We see the Oaks of Bashan tremble, and the Cedars of Lebanon creak and groan under the onslaught of the Axe of humiliation in the mighty hand of God. Pharaoh felt ten distinct axe blows in the plagues before he fell in the Red Sea. Sisera, Ahab, Sennacherib, Belshazzar, Herod, and every other man born of woman feels the edge of God's Axe. John the Baptist knew all about God's Axe. He warned proud Israel, "And now also the axe is laid to the root of the trees: therefore every tree which bringeth not forth good fruit is hewn down and cast into the fire." (Matt. 3:10) Note the word "trees". All trees. All men. All women. All children.

THE AMAZING GRACE OF GOD TOWARD NEBUCHADNEZZAR -

There is, I believe, no other chapter in the Bible quite like Daniel chapter 4. The mightiest king, the head of gold, the sheltering, fruiting tree that blest the whole earth, the Epitome of Earthly Emperors, the pagan Gentile was converted to genuine faith in Jehovah God. God showed mercy to him in that He forewarned him of the Axe's deadly work. And when the Axe bit deep at that last blow, the cut that dropped Nebuchadnezzar from the throneroom to the cowpasture, God bound the stump with bands of Divine preservation for seven years. God saved not only his throne, but his life, and at the appointed time imparted light and gave him eyes to see.

It is possible that we may read in haste the record of Nebuchadnezzar's salvation, and miss the appeal of Daniel to the king. It is found in verse 27, "Wherefore, O king, let my counsel be acceptable unto thee, and break off thy sins by righteousness, and thine iniquities by shewing mercy to the poor; if it may be a lengthening of thy tranquility." What courage Daniel showed in his bold reproofs! Break off thy sins! There is another word for that phrase. It is called "Repent!" Daniel offered hope to the king, but only if he would repent. He appealed to him to bend, to bow, to yield, to submit before the Axe Began to Bite! But he would not. God had to hew him down to the ground. He had to humble the proud king to save him.

Everywhere we look we see God hewing proud men down to the ground. Some of them are potentates, some princes, some professors, and some pastors. Because of pride all men must feel the edge of God's Axe.

How do I know? I have the scars. I still have the grass stains on my knees and the palms of my hands.

But the stump was bound with bands of mercy and love.

It is good for us to remember when the axe began to bite.
