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Feature Article - Counting the Cost - Part 2

In the last issue of Heads Up we published the first part of a sermon on discipleship by Charles Spurgeon. The sermon began thus,

"For which of you, intending to build a tower,sits not down first, and counts the cost, whether he has sufficient to finish it? Lest haply, after he has laid the foundation, and is not able to finish it, all that behold it begin to mock him, saying, This man began to build, and was not able to finish." Luke 14:28-30.

This passage is peculiar to Luke. He tells us that at the time when our Lord uttered



it, great multitudes followed Him. It is observable that when our Lord was forsaken by the crowd, He was not depressed, and when His ministry became popular He was not elated. He was calm and wise in the midst of the excitement of the thronging multitudes. This passage is sufficient evidence of that fact. On this occasion our Lord spoke with a view to the winnowing of the great heap of nominal discipleship which lay before Him, that the chaff might be driven away and only the precious corn might remain.

Wisdom Suggests That We Should Count the Cost

You feel you would like to be a Christian. Dear Friend, give me your hand. I am glad you have such a desire. But as I grasp your hand and would gladly draw you towards Christ, I look you in the face and say, "Do you know what you desire?" Are you sure you desire it? There are men lying on beds of sickness who cry for help, but when they recover and have to go out and battle with the world, the time may come when they will say, "I would just as soon be on the bed of sickness again." I should not like a time to come when any one of you shall say, "I joined the Church, but it was a mistake. I did not weigh the matter rightly. I am now in for it, and I am sorry I am, for I ought not to be where I am." If honest, you ought to give up your profession, if such is the case. If you have no Divine Grace, I hope you will have enough of common honesty not to stick to a practical falsehood. I should grieve, indeed, if that should happen, and therefore this morning, I pray you, count the coat! For mark, if you do not count the cost, you will not be able to carry out your resolves. It is a great building. It is a great war!

No mistake can be greater than the notion that in order to be a Christian there is only needed a measure of emotion during a few days—and the belief of someone decisive hour! If I preached such doctrines I should be deceiving your souls! Faith and repentance are not the work of a week or two, they are a lifework! As long as the Christian is on earth he must repent. And as for faith, it is not saying, "I believe in Jesus, and therefore I am saved," but it is a daily Grace, the trust of a lifetime. The Christian continues, still, to believe and repent until he commences to triumph in eternal Glory. Moreover, faith is continually productive of sanctifying results upon the life of the Believer, or otherwise he is not possessed of the right faith. He who believes in Jesus Christ is saved—but if there were such a thing as a temporary faith there would be such a thing as a temporary salvation. He who truly repents of sin is a renewed man, but if repentance of sin were only a transient thing and were soon over, the life which it indicated would be over, too.

You must not be content with false and fleeting religion! You are beginning to build a tower of which the top stone will never be laid till you are taken up to Heaven—and you are commencing a war which will never end till you exchange the sword for the palm branch.

Remember, also, that to fail in this great enterprise will involve terrible defeat, for what does our Lord say? He says that not to be able to finish will expose you to ridicule. I beg you to notice the form of that ridicule. "All that pass by will begin to mock him, saying one to the other (for that is the force of the expression) this man began to build but was not able to finish." Our Lord does not represent them as saying to the foolish builder, "You began to build and were not able to finish," but as speaking about him as a third person—"This man." Now, half-hearted Christians, half-hearted religious men may not be scoffed at in the public streets to their faces, but they are common butts of ridicule behind their backs. You false professors are universally despised! Worldlings laughingly say, "Ah, these are pretty specimens of Church members!"

The world looks upon a worldly church with utter disdain, and for my part, little do I regret that such derision is poured upon an object which so well deserves it! To be a mere pretender to Christian discipleship is to become an object of scorn in time and in eternity. And such will be the false professor's fate.

Sir, if you mean to be a Christian, resolve that it shall be the right thing, thorough and decided—for then, though men will not go about and praise you to your face, they will honor you—and even those who hate you will know your value. But if you are only half a Christian and not thorough, they may not come to your face and show their contempt, but as they pass by they will sneer and will have more respect for a downright worldling than for you—because he is what he says he is, and makes no pretence of being anything else! But as for you, you began to build and could not finish. What a wretched object is a sham Christian!

We have sometimes seen great buildings which have been commenced and deserted by over-speculative persons. The neighbors have called them "Smithy's Folly," or "Brown's Folly," or "Robinson's Folly," or the like. These are but fleeting causes of derision. But the pretender, the man who, in appearance, commenced to be a Christian and then broke down at it, will be pointed at even by the lost in Hell! The drunkard will cry, "And you? Have you, also, come here? You who were so eloquent about sobriety, and so ready to rebuke the tippler." "Aha!" cries another, "you are the man who lived down our street and made so much show of your religion! You told me I was very wicked, but are you better off than I am?" Behold, I see the openly profane raise themselves up from their racks of remorse to exclaim, "Have you become like one of us? You Church-member, are you, too, in Hell? Is the taste of the sacramental wine still upon your lips? Why, then, do you demand a drop of water to cool your tongue? That sacramental bread which you did swallow so readily, does it not even now stick in your hypocritical throat? You liar before God and man! It is meet and right that you are cast out even as we." Oh, if you must be lost, be lost as anything but hypocrites! If you must perish, perish rather outside the Church than in it!

Do not mock the Lord of Glory! I know of no worse act than to mimic the excellences of the Savior with bold imitation of His Graces! What worse offense can you render to the Majesty of His sacred virtue than to travesty His holiness and mock His perfection?

The Apotheosis of Washington, Oops, I Mean Obama!

Very few Americans know about the painting titled The Apotheosis of Washington in the Capitol building in Washington. Here is an excerpt from an article by that name:

The Apotheosis of Washington in the eye of the Rotunda of the U.S. Capitol was painted in the true fresco technique by Constantino Brumidi in 1865. Brumidi (1805-1880) was born and trained in Rome and had painted in the Vatican and Roman palaces before emigrating to the United States in 1852. A master of creating the illusion of three-dimensional forms and figures on flat walls, Brumidi painted frescoes and murals throughout the Capitol from 1855 until his death.

The Apotheosis of Washington, his most ambitious work at the Capitol, was painted in 11 months at the end of the Civil War, soon after the new dome was completed, for \$40,000. The figures, up to 15 feet tall, were painted to be intelligible from close up as well as from 180 feet below. Some of the groups and figures were inspired by classical and Renaissance images, especially by those of the Italian master Raphael.

In the central group of the fresco, Brumidi depicted George Washington rising to the heavens in glory, flanked by female figures representing Liberty and Victory/Fame. A rainbow arches at his feet, and thirteen maidens symbolizing the original states flank the three central figures. (The word "apotheosis" in the title means literally the raising of a person to the rank of a god, or the glorification of a person as an ideal; George Washington was honored as a national icon in the nineteenth century.)

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Blinded Minds -

Sweden Bans Mention of Jesus at Kids' Advent Services EU's School Diary; No mention of Christmas or Easter.

Education officials said 'prayer, blessings or declarations of faith' are all banned from Christmas services. *The Christian Institute 01 December 2012*

Head teachers in Sweden have been told they can take pupils to Christmas services in church – but Jesus cannot be mentioned.

Advent services for children are part of the curriculum, but religious content has been ruled out by education officials. They said "prayer, blessings or declarations of faith" are all banned, yesterday's Metro newspaper reported.

Last year the Scottish Government came under fire for failing to mention Christmas in its "Winter Festivals" programme. St Andrew's Day, Hogmanay and Burns Night were all mentioned several times in the press release – but Christmas was excluded.

In January 2011 it emerged that more than three million school diaries with no reference to Christmas or Easter had been issued by the EU Commission.

The diaries made reference to Muslim, Hindu, Sikh and Chinese festivities, as well as Europe Day – but December 25th just carried the message: "A true friend is someone who shares your concerns and doubles your joy."

An EU ombudsman later ruled that a separate sheet correcting the omission was "sufficient" – and a reprint was not needed.

In 2009 Christmas carollers were banned from the Houses of Parliament in case they inconvenienced MPs having lunch.

And in the same year Rochdale Borough Council put up Christmas lights in August in order to celebrate the religious festivals of several faiths. The move was described as "absolutely ludicrous" by one local resident.



Words 'Husband' and 'Wife' Axed from Marriage Certificates

The health department in the US state of Washington is to remove the words "husband" and "wife" from marriage and divorce certificates, after same-sex marriage was approved in a recent referendum.

The state began changing the legal document wording

before the public vote even happened, according to a spokesman.

Tim Church, from the health department, said spaces once reserved for a "bride" and "groom" will become more gender-neutral.

He said: "We are proposing a change where it will say something like 'Spouse A' and 'Spouse B'." The law comes into effect on 6 December.

Over 30 states have voted against redefining marriage, just three have voted in favour.

The UK Government has said the words "husband" and "wife" will have to be removed from official documents if marriage is redefined. And in France, the words "mother" and "father" are set to be stripped from official documents, under its plans to redefine marriage.

The move would see the word "parents" used in identical marriage ceremonies for both heterosexual and homosexual weddings. François Hollande, the French President, pledged to introduce same-sex marriage in his manifesto.

In Spain, terms such as "mother" and "father" have become "Progenitor A" and "Progenitor B" on birth certificates.

Rick Warren Condemns Uganda Anti-Gay Bill After Faith, LGBT Groups Call for Response Warren; bill is "unjust, extreme and un-Christian toward homosexuals." By Stoyan Zaimov Christian Post Reporter December 7, 2012



A number of organisations are raising international awareness on the debate concerning Uganda's proposed death penalty for homosexuals, and have called on Saddleback Church pastor Rick Warren to once again speak out on the issue – which he did on Friday via Twitter.

It read: "An unjust law in Uganda is back in the news. I opposed it 3 yrs ago and I still do," which was also shared with The Christian Post by Kristin Cole, a spokesperson for Warren.

In his statement three years ago, Warren stated that it was not his role to interfere with the politics of other countries, but that he still has a duty to speak out on moral issues. He said the bill was "unjust, extreme and un-Christian toward homosexuals."

As to why he hadn't made the statement when the bill first started making rounds in Uganda's parliament, he said that "some erroneously concluded that I supported this terrible bill, and some even claimed I was a sponsor of the bill". He added, "I oppose the criminalisation of homosexuality."

Faithful America, an online community of citizens motivated by various faiths who speak up on social and political issues, shared with us that over 13,000 people have signed an online petition calling for Pastor Warren to take a more prominent stand against the proposed death penalty provision tied to Uganda's anti-gay bill.

GLAAD (Gay & Lesbian Alliance Against Defamation) also shared a blog post where it addressed the danger of the anti-gay bill passing in Uganda, and although the organisation acknowledged that Warren spoke out against it in 2009, it asked that he and other evangelical Christian leaders talk to their followers about the issue once more.

"Why have Rick Warren and other evangelical leaders remained silent? As the bill awaits an imminent parliamentary vote, there is no time for contemplation; direct and decided speech against this bill is the only option as the international community looks to safeguard the LGBT community in Uganda," GLAAD wrote.

Uganda is expected to make a final decision on the anti-gay bill and the proposed death penalty by the end of the year, although no firm date has been set as of yet.

Mormons and Christ -

Who Is Jesus? - Correcting Latter Day Saints (Mormon) Fallacies by Dennis & Rauni Higley

When an LDS person is asked the question, "Do you know Jesus?", many will say, "Of course I know Jesus, I have read stories about Him, I have heard talks about Him, I pray in His name, and I belong to a church that has His name on our buildings." When they say this, the next question to ask is, "Does He know you?" More often than not they then tell about the preexistence, heavenly parents, and how Jesus is our elder

brother and that we grew up there with Him - and thus we know Him and He knows us as His siblings, for we all came from heaven. This answer gives an opening to ask how this could be, for the Bible tells us that Jesus alone came from heaven--we did not (John 8:23; 3:13, 31; 6:62; 1 Corinthians 15:46-47). The Bible teaches of Jesus who is God who became a man to save us from our sin (Matthew 1:23; John 1:1, 14, 29; 3:16).

When Adam sinned and death entered the human race, God promised to send a Redeemer, "the seed of the woman" (Genesis 3:15; Isaiah. 7:14). Jesus of the Bible is that Virgin-born Son of God; God, who is Spirit (John 4:24; Luke 1:26-31). Jesus is indeed Immanuel, God with us. (Matthew 1:23; John 1:1, 14; Galatians 4:4). He is the Lamb of God who takes away the sin of the world (John 1:29). Jesus compared knowing Him to having eternal life (John 17:3). In other words, just knowing about Him without knowing WHO HE IS will not give us eternal life. We have to have a personal relationship with Him.

The Bible warns about false prophets and teachers who teach of another Jesus (same name but a different person - 2 Corinthians 11:4, 13-15). Jesus himself said "Not every one that saith unto Me, Lord, Lord, shall enter the kingdom of heaven." Knowing His name and even having done "wonderful works" in His name but not having personal relationship with Him will not do. "On that day," Judgment Day, He will have to say, "I never knew you: depart from Me" (Matthew 7:21-23). Jesus is God who came to save us from our sins, but if we do not know and acknowledge who He is, the Great I AM, we will die in our sins and therefore cannot enter the kingdom of heaven (John 8:24; 58-59). Only God can forgive sins (Mark 2:7). Jesus is 100 percent God and 100 percent man. "In Him dwells all fullness of the Godhead bodily" (Colossians 2:9). He is the image of the invisible God (Colossians 1:15). He came to fulfill all that the prophets of the Old Testament had foretold about Him. Every book of the Bible is about Him (Luke 24:25-27, 44-47). His life, death, and resurrection is for all who in faith accept Him (1 Corinthians 15:1-4; Romans 10:9-10; Ephesians 2:8-9). When we receive Him, we BECOME children of God (John 1:12-13; 3:7) and are born again of the Spirit of God.

The Mormon Church and its leaders have taught that Jesus was married and a polygamist--as their God the Father also is married and a polygamist--and that all mankind were born as spirit children to him and his many wives in the preexistence, Jesus being the eldest of all of them/us. They teach that since marriage is a requirement for gaining exaltation and godhood in the celestial kingdom, Jesus likewise had to be married in order to become fully a god.

It is amazing how many different ways the enemy of our souls tries to confuse people's minds of the purpose of God becoming a man in Jesus; namely that He became a man to die for our sins, and through faith in Him as our substitute to provide the way for us to go to heaven.

A few years ago, there was Dan Brown's popular novel, The Da Vinci Code, which many, many Mormons and others took as a sure confirmation that Jesus was married to Mary Magdalene and that they had at least one child....This same confusion, and even excitement is up again among Mormons because some fourth century "faded papyrus fragment, only 1.5 inches by 3 inches, likened to the size of a business card or small cell phone has been found-suggesting that Jesus Christ of Nazareth was actually married." This fragment was brought to light a couple of weeks ago by Harvard Divinity School professor, Karen King, who also says "the papyrus fragment, even if it's determined to be authentic, does not provide evidence that Jesus was married, but merely that hundreds of years after Jesus' death and resurrection, some believed He had a wife....The Bible never even hints that Jesus was married." Wolf-Peter Funk, a Coptic linguist, (among others) doubts the authenticity (of this fragment), calling its form "suspicious." He told the AP "there's no way to evaluate the significance of the fragment because it has no context. There are thousands of scraps of papyrus where you find crazy things," said Funk, (co-director of a project editing the Nag Hammadi Coptic library at Laval University in Quebec). "It can be anything," he said. "Part of the mystery of the fragment is that no one seems to be sure of its origin and provenance, a history of where it has been. Plus, its owner has asked to remain anonymous. This is now being labeled by experts as fraudulent...." (Copied from WND report of 9/19/12, emphasis added.)

It is amazing to see how gullible people indeed are. The New Testament, written during the First Century A.D. by eyewitnesses of Jesus' life and His death, burial, resurrection, and ascension to heaven, does not say anything about Jesus being married, but a tiny fragment by an anonymous writer, without context to anything, written about 350 years after Jesus' life, is all of a sudden taken as "proof" that He was married! It is incredible that people are so eager to believe something like this, and by so doing they discredit God's purposes and Jesus as the Lamb of God who takes away the sins of the world (John 1:29).

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How Can I tell If The Church I Attend Is Becoming Emergent/Emerging?

Some Contemplative Terms and What they Mean

In order to help others who might be involved with some form of mysticism, it is important to be aware of these terms and understand their basic meanings:

Altered State of Consciousness

A meditative or drug induced non-ordinary state of mind.

Ancient Wisdom

The supposed laws of the Universe that, when mastered, enable one to see one's own divinity–another word for metaphysics or occultism.

Aquarius/Aquarian Age

Sign of the Zodiac represented by the water carrier, Earth Age, associated with this astrological sign. The term New Age refers to the coming Aquarian age which is in the process of replacing the Pisces age. According to astrologers, every 2,000 years constitutes an age. New Agers predict this Aquarian age will be a time of utopia.

Centering/Centering Prayer

Another term for contemplative meditation (going deep within your center). A type of meditation being promoted in many mainline churches under the guise of prayer.

Chakras

Believed by New Agers to be the seven energy centers in man which open up during the kundalini effect in meditation.

Christ consciousness

Taught by New Agers to be the state of awareness, reached in meditation, in which one realizes that one is divine and one with God and thereby becoming a Christ or an enlightened being.

Contemplative Prayer

Going beyond thought by the use of repeated words or phrases.

Creative Visualization

Imaging in the mind, during meditation, what you want to occur and then expecting it to happen. In simple terms, you are creating your own reality. Desert Fathers Monks who lived as hermits beginning around the third century who first taught the practice of contemplative prayer.

Ecstasy (or Bliss)

The hoped for outcome of contemplative prayer or mediation

False Self

The false self is the ego or personality that is observable by others. One rids oneself of the false self to find the true self through mantra-meditation. New Agers would consider people like Buddha, Gandhi, and even Jesus Christ as examples of people who found their true self.

Higher Self

Supposed God-self within that New Agers seek to connect with through meditation. Also called the Christ-self or True-self.

Interspirituality

The view that all the world's religions are identical at the mystical level and therefore there should be solidarity among them.

Jesus Prayer

A popular version of this prayer is Lord Jesus Christ, Son of God, have mercy on me, a sinner, often abbreviated to Jesus.

Kundalini

Powerful energy that is brought on through meditation, associated with the Chakras.

Lectio Divina

Means sacred reading. In today's contemplative movement, it often involves taking a single word or small phrase from Scripture and repeating the words over and over again.

Mantra

Word or words repeated either silently or verbally to induce an altered state of consciousness.

Meditation

Meditation is practiced by all major world religions and is often described as an essential discipline for spiritual growth. Yet, like mysticism, there is great diversity in the practice of meditation. While some see mediation as simply spending time thinking quietly about life or about God, others use meditation techniques to experience altered states of consciousness that allow them to have esoteric experiences.

In addition, meditation is promoted in secular society for the personal benefits of health, relaxation, and improved productivity.

Metaphysical

Beyond the physical realm or pertaining to the supernatural.

Mysticism

A direct experience of the supernatural realm.

New Age

The Age of Aquarius, supposedly the Golden Age, when man becomes aware of his power and divinity. New Thought

A movement that tries to merge classic occult concepts with Christian terminology.

Pantheism

God is all things. The universe and all life are connected in a sum. This sum is the total reality of God. Thus, man, animals, plants, and all physical matter are seen as equal. The assumption - all is one, therefore all is deity.

Panentheism

God is in all things. In panentheism God is both personal and is also in all of creation. It is a universal view that believes God is in all people and that someday all of God's creation will be saved and be one with Him.

Reiki

Spiritual energy that is channeled by one attuned to the Reiki power. Literally translated God energy.

Sacred Space

Either a physical spot where one goes to engage in a mystical practice or the actual silence or the state of being during the mystical experience.

Spiritual Formation

The teaching and application of the spiritual disciplines; a vehicle for contemplative prayer

The silence

Absence of normal thought.

Spiritual Director

One who promotes or trains people in the spiritual disciplines including the silence.

Universalism

The belief that all humanity has or will ultimately have a positive connection and relationship with God.

HALDEMAN ON "NON-ESSENTIALS" (Friday Church News Notes, December 7, 2012, <u>www.wayoflife.org</u> <u>fbns@wayoflife.org</u>, 866-295-4143) - The following is from a series of sermons on the Second Coming preached in 1916 by I.M. Haldeman, First Baptist Church, New York City: "I desire to speak parenthetically and say to you that of all foolish, absurd and actually stupid things uttered by the tongue of Christians or written by pen, nothing is more excuse less than this attempted arraignment of 'non-essentials.'

If the Bible be the revelation of God, as He is the great economist and never wastes or does anything that is unnecessary, it is evident He could not and would not introduce into His infallible Book anything that was not essential. Whatever statement or doctrine therefore may be in the Bible, however apparently inconsequential and insignificant, is, nevertheless, essential. Since this doctrine of the Second Coming is very manifestly in, and a remarkable part of, the Bible it ought to be evident, to say the least, that the term 'non-essential' cannot in any wise be applied to it" (*I.M. Haldeman*, Ten Sermons on the Second Coming, 1916).

Independent Baptist Churches Adrift! -

I have never been much of a lover for organized church fellowships or associations. One reason is that I have seen for years the various independent Baptist fellowships and associations drifting further and further from their once supposed position on ecclesiastical separation. The problems with "belonging" to a fellowship is when one or several men and their churches begin to drift you either (1) continue on without question (2) question the pastors and take the consequence which usually means shut up or (3) simply get out.

In the independent Baptist's it usually means leaving the King James Bible for a version such as the ESV, adopting softness toward new evangelicals, adopting CCM music, closer association with the Southern Baptist Convention, adopting Reformed theology and departing from dispensational teaching.

This drift is seen in the following articles. The General Association of Regular Baptist churches (GARBC) many years ago was a separatist group of churches but today that is not so. Many churches in the GARBC have drifted into compromise and this drift was helped along by the schools. For instance Cedarville University was an approved school of the GARBC but because it and the other approved schools were moving into new evangelicalism the GARBC ceased their approval programme. Today at least two of the former approved GARBC schools are approved by the Southern Baptist Convention. The following articles are an indication of where the drift in Biblical separation will take a church, school and a fellowship.



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Eddy-Torial - Prosthetics in the Body of Christ -

Artificial limbs are becoming the norm in our churches, the body of Christ. And we are more and more accustomed to these innovations. In almost every church we visit we see people who don't belong. Oh, they may be members, and even be in leadership positions, but there is no grace, no joy, no love for the brethren, and no heart for souls. There is a certain mechanical mobility and sometimes we observe that they have a clockwork regularity in attendance. When they sing we hear,



not the praises of our God and Saviour, but the precise semi-demi-hemi quavers of trained performers instead of enraptured worshippers. Even in our pulpits we are hearing men who are polished to a fare thee well, but there is no more substance to their messages than a spider's web.

In apostolic times the churches were eyewitnesses of "God set(ting) the members every one of them in the body as it pleased Him." (I Cor. 12:18). There was none of the foolishness of the charismatics saying that men needed to seek the gift of tongues or healing. They knew that it was the Spirit's work to divide (the gifts) severally to every man as He would (I Cor. 12:11). And when the apostles perceived a wooden leg trying to attach itself to the body of Christ, they confronted him with his sin and called on him to repent (Acts 8:20-23). If need be they delivered the glass eye members to Satan that they might learn not to blaspheme (I Tim. 1:20) Some who professed to be true members of the body (Acts 5:1-11 & I Cor. 5:1-13)

The apostles knew better than to worry about political correctness and avoiding ever offending pretend Christians. Rather, they chose to do all that was in their power to maintain the health of the Body.

This was the pattern revealed to the apostle Paul as the mystery of the church. If we were to read again the 3rd and 4th chapters of Ephesians we would see that local churches were bodies of believers, both of Jews and Gentiles, and that they were strong bodies (Eph. 3:16). They were lively and gifted and greatly graced (Eph. 4:1-11). They were growing bodies (4:12, 13) and increasingly resistant to error (4:14). They were more and more like their Head, who is Christ (4:15).

And the members each contributed to the growth of the body! "From whom the whole body, fitly joined together and compacted by that which every joint supplieth, according to the effectual working in the measure of every part, maketh increase of the body unto the edifying of itself in love."

Eph. 4:16 This great truth has become a forgotten precept in our churches.

The most we can hope for from the prosthetic members of the church is that they will come and be spectators. Any hope that they will be participants is long gone. Pray fervently for God's blessing on the church's ministries? Teach a Sunday School class? Witness to the lost? Greet a visitor and show them the love of Christ? Bro. Wooden Legg and sister Glass Eye are not interested. Don't ask.

We can't help wondering where is that factory that is producing prosthetic legs and arms, bionic ears, and digital eyes for the body of Christ?

Our old pastor, Bro. A.V. Henderson, once told us of the pastor of a large church near Baylor seminary, and of his experience with lifeless church members. He preached the Word of God faithfully, but perceived that his church was filled with prosthetic toes and ears and feet and hands. He observed that his people were bored with the saving gospel of Christ. He watched them doze off to sleep Sunday after Sunday under the preaching of the word of God.

So one Sunday, in the middle of his sermon, he departed from his outline and from his imagination he wove a tale about a sheepdog, a sheepdog in Scotland long ago. The tale he told had no basis in fact. It was a fairy tale he made up as he went along. His powers of description were such that he woke up the sleepy saints and wooed them into the web he wove. He told of the sheep that grazed safely on the moors, completely unaware of the storm clouds on the horizon. Not even the shepherd in his cottage knew that the clouds were full of moisture or that it would soon fall as snow, driven by fierce winds.

Suddenly, the storm struck and the sheep were pushed before it, blinded by the snow, their fleeces soaked and cold and heavy. The poor worried old shepherd watched as the flurries blotted out the sheep of his flock, and he feared the loss every one of them. He called his faithful old sheepdog to his side and pointed him out into the storm with a command to bring the sheep to the fold.

Bring them in, Shep! Bring them all in!

And away flew the old dog, into the teeth of the storm, snow blinded, running by memory, with his nose high, sniffing for the sheep and his ears up, hoping to hear them bleating for help.

(As he told his tale the old pastor saw that every eye was upon him now and every ear attentive, and still he led them on into the snare he laid for them...)

Shep raced down the lane and leapt over the fence expecting to find the flock waiting at the gate, but the wind had driven them away. Quartering back and forth he searched the paddock until he came to the gate that was left open to the moors. He paused to look back at the house, but it was lost to view. He barked

once and again and then bolted through the gate and across the moor, searching, searching, searching, and then the wind shifted and even the faithful old dog lost his bearings. He wandered nearer and nearer the cliff. His head was coated with icicles and his feet bleeding from the cold.

Still he sought the sheep, but in vain. He could no longer see because of the snow, but he would not give up the search. Had not his master commanded him to bring them home? He knew not that he had lost his way or that the cliff was near until suddenly the ground fell away beneath him and he fell. Down, down into the darkness, on to the rocks, with his back broken and his legs now crippled. The snow covered his form, and... 
And the old pastor left the pulpit and went home.
