I want to also thank everyone who has written to encourage what we are doing. Our generation has almost become an age of illiterates through the use of electronic media. TV, movies, the internet, mobile phones, and social media have allured almost the entire population of the world away from reading books. Sadly, we who know Christ have been snared as well, to the extent that we behave as though God had given us a picture book instead of a word book, the Bible. Anyone who publishes reading material has to come sooner or later to the realisation that most people will not read what he sends them, and will not even be bothered to ask to be dropped from the mailing list. It is much easier to just hit the delete button, not caring that the truths they needed for that day's battle were contained in the deleted publication. It is so much easier to get an amusement hit off YouTube or FaceBook. We are becoming Dopamine Dopes and illiterate at the same time.

One of the most useful responses to Heads Up has been the reproofs we receive from readers. I know, it is considered heresy among independent Baptist pastors, but reproofs are a key to growth in grace. I often laugh out loud when I receive reproofs from pastors for including reproofs in the articles in Heads Up. (I'm sure they don't realize they just offered support for the biblical truth of reproof by their condemnation of reproving error.) Nevertheless, your reproofs are appreciated and have helped to refine the work of editing Heads Up. I thank you and invite your reproofs in time to come.

We have some really important biblical themes to pursue in Heads Up in 2013. I asked pastors all over the world for assistance in understanding what kind of stones are the living stones the Lord uses to build His churches with, and will be sharing their answers with you soon. I asked for their insights on why movies are so dangerous (whether in a movie theatre, on DVD's, or TV, or off the Internet) and was surprised to read their answers. Feature Article - Counting the Cost, Part 3

(Two issues ago we published the first part of this sermon by Charles Spurgeon on discipleship. if you did not receive the previous parts of this sermon, it can be read at http://www.gracebaptistmalanda.net.au/index.html. Just look in Resources at the top of our church's web page and click on the previous two issues. - Ed.)

The last word shall be this, that COST WHATEVER IT MAY, TRUE RELIGION IS WORTH THE COST. We are like a man with the black pest upon him who knows that he is dying and yet yonder is a drug which will heal him. "Physician," says he, "you ask so great a price that each drop costs me a diamond! You are demanding more than its weight in choicest pearls, but it does not matter, I must have it! If I do not, I am a dead man—and then what will it profit me that I have kept my gold?" It is the case of every one of us here present—we must have Christ or perish forever— and it will be

better for us to cut off our right arm and pluck out our right eye than that we should be cast into Hell fire!



Mark you, Brothers and Sisters, the present blessings of true religion are worth all the cost. What if I have to rend some fond connection? Jesus, You are better to me than husband, wife, or child. If it must be so that she who lies in my bosom shall count me for her enemy, You shall be in my heart, my Savior, better than a Rachel, or a Rebekah. Yes, if it must be so that my father shall say, "You shall never darken my doors again if you follow Christ," he must say it, for when father and mother forsake me the Lord will take me up. The immediate joy will recompense for the immediate loss.

Yes, doubtless you may count all things but loss for the excellency of the knowledge of Christ Jesus your Lord and yet remain a gainer. And again, what recompense comes for all cost in the consolation afforded by true godliness in the article of death? To lie a-dying—why it will give no pain to be able to say, then, "I was cast out of any family for Jesus." It will be no sorrow to remember, "I was ridiculed for Christ." It will cause us no pangs to say, "I was counted too precise and too much of a Puritan." No, my Brothers and Sisters, those are not the things which put thorns into death pillows. Oh, no! There we shall see how sweet it was to have borne any part of Jesus' Cross—a sliver of His Cross will be worth a king's ransom on a dying day! Moreover, at the Judgment, when the trumpet rings out and the dead are rising, we shall not say, "I suffered too much for Christ."

When to the right His chosen go, and we among them, we shall not look back with regret to the fact that we lost caste in society and position among the refined for Jesus' sake! We shall not lament that we attended a despised conventicle and worshipped among the poor of this world out of love to Jesus, and fidelity to His Gospel. Oh, no! I guarantee you in that day he shall shine brightest who was most beclouded for his Lord's sake! Midst the bright ones, doubly bright shall be the martyr band of whom the world was not worthy—who were accounted as the offscouring of all things! And while each one of the disciples shall receive a hundredfold for all he may have given up for his Lord's cause, these shall have the fairest portion.

Moreover, let me remind you, Beloved, that Christ asks you to give up nothing that will injure you. If you must hate father and mother it is only in this sense—that you will not yield to their wrong requests, nor will you leave Christ for them. If you must give up any pleasure it is because it is not a fitting pleasure for you—it is poisonous sugar of lead— and not true sweetness. Christ will give you greater enjoyments by far. I remember that our Redeemer does not ask any one of us to do what He has not done Himself. That thought pierces me to the quick—I wish it might affect you, also. Master, do You say, give up my father? Did You not leave Your Father? Do You bid me even leave my father's house if it must be for Your sake? Did You not leave the glorious mansions of Heaven? What if I am called to bear reproach? They called the Master of the house Beelzebub! What if I am cast out? They also cast You out. When we think of the scourging, the shame and the spitting which the Lord endured, what are our griefs?

And if, for His sake, we should even be condemned to death we know how He hung on the Cross, stripped of His all, that He might save us from the wrath to come! O Believer, can you follow your Lord where ever He goes? Soldiers of the Cross, can you follow Him? Is the path smooth enough for those dear feet and too rough for you? There He is in the center of the battle where the blows fall fastest—will you follow Him? Dare you follow Him, or do you pine for the tents of ease and the soft couches of the cowards, yonder, who are shrinking back and deserting to the enemy?

Oh, by everything that is good, if you are, indeed, His followers, I charge you, cry, "Where He is, there let His servant be! As He fares, so let His servant fare—in this world let His humiliation be ours so that in the world to come we may partakers of His Glory." This is strong preaching, you tell me, but the Savior meant all that I have said. His was a testing discourse, but there are Truths of God to be remembered which may console us while hearing them. It is true that you cannot build the tower—Joshua said to the people in his time—"You cannot serve the Lord." If you have counted the cost, you know, by this time, that you cannot wage the war. Ten thousand cannot stand against twenty thousand. But yet it must be done, inevitable necessity drives on behind—whatever may be in front—we dare not turn back. Remember Lot's wife. What, then, must we do? Hear the Lord's words, "With men it is impossible, but with God all things are possible." Are you willing? Then the Spirit of God will help you! You shall give up the world and the flesh without a sigh! You shall fight against your lusts and you shall overcome them through the blood of the Lamb! The tower shall be built and the Lord shall inhabit it! Cast yourselves on Jesus by a simple faith—rest in His power—and from day to day believe in His strength, and He will bear you safely through! Do you notice the verse which follows this passage? I wonder whether anything like it will follow my sermon. It is astonishing that though Jesus thundered out as from the top of Sinai and His words seemed harsh, yet it is written, "Then drew near unto Him all the publicans and sinners for to hear Him," as if they said to themselves, "This man tells us the Truth of God, therefore we will hear Him." And then He began to tell them the precious Truths of His Free Grace, acting just as the farmer does who puts in the plow and turns up the soil—when he sees the clods breaking in the furrow, then he scatters the golden seed—but not till then.

Listen, every one of you who would have Christ! Come, and have Him! You who would have salvation, accept it as the gift of His Sovereign Grace! But do not receive it under misapprehension—understand what is meant by it. Salvation is not deliverance from Hell, alone—it is deliverance from sin! It is not the rescue of men, merely from eternal pain—it is their redemption from this world's vain and wicked ways! It cannot be divided! It is a garment without seam, woven from the top throughout. If you would have justification, you must have sanctification! If you would have pardon, you must have holiness! It you would be one with Christ, you must be separate from sinners. If you would walk the streets of gold above, you must walk the road of holiness below! God grant you His Holy Spirit to enable you to do so and His shall be the praise forever! Amen.

Belgium looks at euthanasia for minors, Alzheimer's sufferers

AFP - Belgium is considering a significant change to its decade-old euthanasia law that would allow minors and Alzheimer's sufferers to seek permission to die. The proposed changes to the law were submitted to parliament Tuesday by the Socialist party and are likely to be approved by other parties, although no date has yet been put forward for a parliamentary debate. "The idea is to update the law to take better account of dramatic situations and extremely harrowing cases we must find a response to," party leader Thierry Giet said. The draft legislation calls for "the law to be extended to minors if they are capable of discernment or affected by an incurable illness or suffering that we cannot alleviate." Belgium was the second country in the world after the Netherlands to legalise euthanasia in 2002 but it applies only to people over the age of 18.

Socialist Senator Philippe Mahoux, who helped draft the proposed changes, said there had been cases of adolescents who "had the capacity to decide" their future. He said parliamentarians would also consider extended mercy-killing to people suffering from Alzheiner's-type illnesses.


Euthanasia was allowed to an Alzheimer's patient for the first time in the Netherlands last year.

In Belgium, some 1,133 cases -- mostly for terminal cancer -- were recorded in 2011, about one percent of all deaths in the country, according to official figures.

A seriously ill prisoner serving a long jail sentence this year became the first inmate to die under Belgium's euthanasia laws.

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Would It Work To Put God Back In Schools?



We often hear people say that we must put God back into our schools (as the poster suggests). But I wonder if we have given any thought to what kind of religion the government would put into our schools? Which religion would it be? Modernism? Emergent? Muslim? Mormon? Paedophilic Catholicism? Rick Warren's Purpose Driven Drivel? Joel Osteen's Feel Good Church? And what Bible would Barrack and Nancy and Harry and John be happy with? And do you think they would permit anyone to really, truly preach the ten commandments to show students their sins? Or would they approve pastors calling students and teachers to repentance (if even one could be found that still preached repentance?) And do you think we could preach that Jesus Christ alone can save from sin? And what about preaching the cross? And the resurrection? And the Great White Throne Judgment? And Hell and the Lake of Fire? Oh, you say, "We can't include those things! They are too controversial! We might offend someone! We must respect the rights of others!

"So what kind of religion do you have in mind, if you want religion to be put back in our schools?

What we see promoted in the poster is the Fairy Tale Christianity that is so common in Independent Baptist Churches at present. Dreamy-eyed preachers and sleepy saints whisper their lullabies again and again, never caring that the religion they desire is not Christian.

What is needed is not simply for God to be put back into our schools. He must first be invited into our hearts, through repentant faith in Christ! And He must be invited back into our families. He must become the true Head of our men so they can become the real head of their wives (I Cor. 11). And He must be invited back into our churches. If there is any semblance of life left in our churches, it is Laodicean in nature, and if that is true, then the Lord of the churches is standing outside knocking and seeking fellowship with any man who will open to Him. Before He can be put back into the schools, we must see Him preached in public. He must be put back into the public forum by bold unashamed Christian witness, even if it means we do so from a prison cell.

What we are describing is called revival.

Revival is costly. It only comes to those who desire it so desperately that they will lose their lives to obtain it.

That's how we got (Bible based) religion into our schools to start with.

Of course, America could decide to let godless men choose which religion becomes the faith of generations to come.

It's been done before.

HOW WE SHOULD REACT TO THE SIGNS OF THE TIMES

The signs of the end times are everywhere. Our upcoming book The Bible According to the Future contains a large chapter on these. The strange thing is that believers often react to the signs the very opposite of how God intends for us to react. As we witness such things as the spread of globalism, the building of a one-world church, the increase of wickedness, the breakdown of the traditional family, the destruction of that priceless bastion of liberty called America, the normalization of homosexuality, the callous murder of babies, the filthy pop culture, the breathtaking increase in governmental surveillance, we become fearful, uncertain, frustrated, angry, and discouraged, but this is because our minds and hearts are too focused on things of this world rather than things above. Too often we have the same short view that "conservative" unbelievers have rather than the long view that comes from the light of Bible prophecy. Doubtless there will be frustration and discouragement, because we aren't spiritual robots who are unaffected by our environment, but our response should be tempered by the truths of God's Word. We should respond to the times in a dramatically different way than our unsaved friends and neighbors. When we consider what is happening in the world, we should respond in at least the following ways.

First, we should rejoice greatly in our salvation. "But rejoice, inasmuch as ye are partakers of Christ's sufferings; that, when his glory shall be revealed, ye may be glad also with exceeding joy" (1 Pet. 4:13).

Second, we should be comforted that Christ's return is drawing near. "And when these things begin to come to pass, then look up, and lift up your heads; for your redemption draweth nigh" (Lk. 21:28).

Third, we should be encouraged that God is in control. "For the mystery of iniquity doth already work: only he who now letteth will let, until he be taken out of the way" (2 Th. 2:7).

Fourth, we should stand in the confidence that the present evil is exceedingly temporary and will soon be cut down. "Rest in the LORD, and wait patiently for him: fret not thyself because of him who prospereth in his way, because of the man who bringeth wicked devices to pass. Cease from anger, and forsake wrath: fret not thyself in any wise to do evil. For evildoers shall be cut off: but those that wait upon the LORD, they shall inherit the earth. For yet a little while, and the wicked shall not be: yea, thou shalt diligently consider his place, and it shall not be. But the meek shall inherit the earth; and shall delight themselves in the abundance of peace" (Psa. 37:7-11).

Fifth, we must do more praying. "I exhort therefore, that, first of all, supplications, prayers, intercessions, and giving of thanks, be made for all men; For kings, and for all that are in authority; that we may lead a quiet and peaceable life in all godliness and honesty. For this is good and acceptable in the sight of God our Saviour; Who will have all men to be saved, and to come unto the knowledge of the truth. For there is one God, and one mediator between God and men, the man Christ Jesus; Who gave himself a ransom for all, to be testified in due time" (1 Tim. 2:1-6). Desperate times call for more praying, but we are witnessing a dearth of prayer in the typical Bible-believing church. There is lots of partying and lots of activities and fun but not a lot of praying. 1 Timothy 2 ties prayer together with living a quiet and peaceable life and the liberty to preach the gospel, the very things that we want.

Finally, we should be busy in the harvest fields. "But, beloved, be not ignorant of this one thing, that one day is with the Lord as a thousand years, and a thousand years as one day. The Lord is not slack concerning his promise, as some men count slackness; but is longsuffering to us-ward, not willing that any should perish, but that all should come to repentance" (2 Pet. 3:8-9). The Bible plainly says that Christ is waiting because He wants to save souls. Instead of fretting at the signs of the times, we need to rededicate ourselves to proclaiming the gospel to every person in every nation and building sound Bible-believing churches where God's people can be protected, edified, trained, discipled, and where godly Christian homes can be built and children can be prepared as arrows in the hand of the Lord to go out and do battle against the forces of evil.

With these clumsy hands of mine."


"The secret of unfolding flowers Is not known to such as I. GOD opens this flower so easily, But in my hands they die."

Fourteen Is the New Fifteen!

According to the leaders of the global warming doomsday cult, the average surface temperature of Earth is 14 degrees Celsius (57.2 degrees Fahrenheit), but this is a new value which has quietly replaced the original average of 15 degrees Celsius (59 degrees Fahrenheit).

In March 1988, a few months before NASA's James Hansen asserted before the Congress that global warming was in progress, the New York Times quoted him

as saying that he used 59 degrees Fahrenheit as the average global temperature to calculate the temperature variations.

One of the scientists, Dr. James E. Hansen of the National Aeronautics and Space Administration's Institute for Space Studies in Manhattan, said he used the 30-year period 1950-1980, when the average global temperature was 59 degrees Fahrenheit, as a base to determine temperature variations.

In July of the same year, a report in the Connecticut-based newspaper The Day was consistent with this claim. According to the Day's report on Hansen's congressional testimony: Dr. Hansen informed the lawmakers that the first five months of 1988 were the hottest five-month period on record, averaging four-tenths of a degree above a 30-year (1950-1980) norm of 59 degrees Fahrenheit. Although Hansen's recent publications provide his version of the differences from the base temperature for various years, he is careful enough not to provide either the observed temperatures or the value of the baseline temperature. However, Hansen at one time revealed his base value in an academic publication. That paper, "Climate Impact of Increasing Atmospheric Carbon Dioxide," appeared in Science in August 1981 and states:

The mean surface temperature is Ts \sim 288 K. Two hundred and eighty-eight K, or 288 Kelvin, is the same as 15 degrees Celsius. A report in the Schenectady-based Daily Gazette indicates that Hansen and his colleague Helene Wilson used this value at least as late as 1992. Thus, Hansen consistently used 15 degrees Celsius as the baseline average for several years.

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James Hansen was not the only person to use this value. When the Intergovernmental Panel on Climate Change (IPCC), which was set up soon after Hansen's 1988 testimony before the Congress, came out with its First Assessment Report in 1990, a table on page xxxvii of the report listed the "Observed Surface Temperature" of Earth as 15 degrees Celsius. Yet another person who used 15 degrees Celsius as the global average temperature was Anthony J. McMichael, an activist professor whose e-mail promising to pull strings in the Australian government figured in the Climategate scandal. According to McMichael's 1993 book, Planetary Overload: Global Environmental Change and the Health of the Human Species:

Average temperature over past 10,000 years = 15°C

As it turned out, the average temperature of 15 degrees Celsius was an inconvenient value that did not support the allegations of global warming. In 1996, Michael Mann (who shot to fame during the Climategate scandal as the creator of "Mike's Nature trick" to "hide the decline") co-authored a paper titled "Greenhouse Warming and changes in the seasonal cycle of temperature: Model versus observations." The paper pointed out that the predictions made by climate models were not consistent with observed data and the variability in temperature likely resulted from natural phenomena. ... the signature of greenhouse warming is scarcely evident in the observational data[.] ... It is possible that observed trends in phase, largely influenced by mid-latitude continental interiors, do not arise from greenhouse warming, but rather from natural variability. Such a notion is reinforced by the fact that marginally-significant trends are found in the control GFDL annual cycle, presumably due to organized century-scale internal variability.

If, on the other hand, the observed variation in the seasonal cycle truly represents a "fingerprint" of greenhouse warming, the GFDL and CCM1 models do not appear capable of capturing the detailed responses of the seasonal cycle to greenhouse forcing.

Discrepancies between the observed and model-predicted trends must be resolved before a compelling connection can be drawn between 20th century changes in the behavior of the annual cycle in temperature, and anthropogenic forcing of the climate.

Significantly, Mann used 15 degrees Celsius as the baseline temperature while calculating the parameters of the annual temperature cycle (see Figure 2 in his paper). Although he could have picked any value in the cycle, he picked 15 degrees Celsius, and it is reasonable to assume that he did so because it was the accepted long-term global average temperature.

Not long after Mann's paper was published, the Worldwatch Institute, an organization based in Washington, D.C., came out with the 1997 edition of Vital Signs, its annual publication. The publication had a chapter with the title "Global Temperature Down Slightly."

In literature published after the 1997 report by Worldwatch Institute, the leaders of the global warming movement seem to have started using 14 degrees Celsius for the global average temperature. In 2002, the Sydney Morning Herald quoted James Hansen, who mentioned this new average. This year the Earth's average temperature was 14.64C, compared with the long-term average of 14C, said James Hansen, of NASA's Goddard Institute for Space Studies, who analyses the data collected from thousands of weather stations around the world.

The IPCC too now uses 14 degrees Celsius as its base temperature, as can be seen from a graph that is part of its 2007 document. (As an aside, it was in 2007 that IPCC won the Nobel Peace Prize. IPCC certainly deserved a Nobel Prize, but it should have been for literature, as the organization had excelled in writing fantasy.) More recently, a 2011 report by the Government Accountability Office attributes an estimated average surface air temperature of 287 K, or 14 degrees Celsius, to James Hansen and his colleagues.

But Hansen and colleagues have estimated that Earth's actual average surface air temperature between 1951 and 1980 was approximately 287 K (14 degrees Celsius) (Hansen et al. 2010).

It is hard to pinpoint the exact date when the change from 15 degrees to 14 degrees was introduced. It most likely happened sometime in 1997, and definitely no later than January of 1998. The 1998 edition of the annual publication of Worldwatch Institute uses 14 degrees Celsius as the global average temperature and provides details of how it was informed of the change from 15 degrees Celsius. On page 69 of the report, a footnote below the table listing the global average temperatures for several years states: Base number is 1 degree Celsius lower than in earlier Vital Signs.

On page 174 of the same report, we see the explanation for the change. In earlier versions of Vital Signs, Worldwatch added the temperature change reported by the Goddard Institute to an estimated global temperature of 15 degrees Celsius, but the institute has since informed Worldwatch that a better base number would be 14 degrees Celsius. James Hansen, Goddard Institute for Space Studies, New York, email to author, 18 January 1998.

In other words, James Hansen sent word that 14 is the new 15.

Eddy-Torial - The Baggage We Bring With Us - Part 1



I have always been interested in those ten camels of Abraham's eldest servant. You know the ones I mean. Their portrait is penned by the Spirit in Gen. 24:10. One camel for the servant, maybe two for his helpers, if such there were, one camel (by faith) for Isaac's bride, Maybe another to carry the servants' baggage and basic foodstuffs, and five camels' loads of treasure? All right, if you don't agree with my estimates, you add them up as you like. The simple fact is that Eliezer (was that his name?) carried baggage with him on his pilgrimage.

And so do I.

F. W. Boreham's first book was called the *Luggage of Life* (1912, Epworth press). In the chapter by that title he wrote, "Life is largely a matter of luggage. So soon as a child can toddle he displays an insatiable passion for carrying things. He is never so happy as when he is loaded. His face beams with delight when his back is burdened to the point of breaking. A few months later he cries for a wooden horse and cart, that he may further gratify his inordinate longing for luggage. And, if these appetites be not humoured, he will exhaust his unconsecrated energies in pushing the chairs, tugging at tables, and carrying the cat. The instinct is there. You can no more deny him his load than you can deny him his lunch. The craving for both is born in him. In his autobiography, Thomas Guthrie tells how the blood of Scottish lads was stirred as the echoes of Waterloo reached that remote hamlet. 'Many a time,' he says, 'did we boys tramp a mile or two out of town to meet troops marching to the war, and proud we were to be allowed to carry a soldier's musket, which the poor fellows, burdened with all the heavy accoutrements of those days, and wearied with a twelve-hour march on a hot summer's day, were glad enough to resign to us.' Here is the same subtle law in operation. Man often loves without knowing that he loves; and little as he suspects it, he is deeply in love with his load."

Oh I know, neither you nor I are tortoises with our houses on our backs, but we do, WE DO have our baggage. You carry yours and I carry mine. We gather it up from earliest days, bit by bit, piece by piece, adding to and subtracting from our load all the way to the grave. And there we leave most of it behind. Well, we leave behind the visible clutter of our packrat pilgrimmage. But God says, "And I heard a voice from heaven saying unto me, Write, Blessed are the dead which die in the Lord from henceforth: Yea, saith the Spirit, that they may rest from their labours; and their works do follow them." - 3. His prayer life, in verses 12-14, and 42-45.
- 4. His worship and praise of God, in vv. 26, 27 and 48, 52.
- 5. And his sincerity and honesty, in v. 49.

You have challenged me to pack in private the luggage of my life and to do so with great care.
